**Entrance Procession**

**Entrance Procession**

These are holy men who became friends of God, glorious heralds of divine truth.

**First Reading - Genesis 3:1-8**

**Responsorial Psalm - Ps 31:1-2, 5-7**

*R. Happy are those whose sins are forgiven.*

Happy the man whose offence is forgiven,  
whose sin is remitted.

O happy the man to whom the Lord  
imputes no guilt,  
in whose spirit is no guile. R.

But now I have acknowledged my sins;  
my guilt I did not hide.  
I said: 'I will confess  
my offence to the Lord.'  
And you, Lord, have forgiven  
the guilt of my sin. R.

So let every good man pray to you  
in the time of need.  
The floods of water may reach high  
but him they shall not reach. R.

**Responsorial Psalm - Ps 89:2-6, 12-13**

*R. In every age, O Lord, you have been our refuge.*

you are God, without beginning or end. R.

You turn men back into dust  
and say: 'Go back, sons of men.'  
To your eyes a thousand years
