MONDAY 2nd December 2024 Monday of the first week of Advent

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON:

Hear the word of the Lord, O nations; declare it to the distant lands: Behold, our Saviour will come; you need no longer fear.

FIRST READING: Isaiah 2:1-5

RESPONSORIAL PSALM:

Ps 121:1-2, 4-5, 6-9

R. Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord.

I rejoiced when I heard them say: 'Let us go to God's house.' And now our feet are standing within your gates, O Jerusalem. R.
