### **Readings for today: Exodus 17:3-7; Romans 5:1-2, 5-8; John 4:5-42**



*Dear friends,*

Archbishop Emeritus John Bathersby died on Monday morning. His funeral will be celebrated in the Cathedral of St. Stephen on Monday 16 March at 11 a.m.

Archbishop John was a wonderful servant and shepherd to the Church of Brisbane. Arriving here in 1992, after serving as Bishop of Cairns, Archbishop Bathersby's friendly style quickly won him many friends. His Stanthorpe upbringing was never far from the surface and the boy from the bush knew instinctively what it was to be a shepherd and pastor.

He spent a number of years as the Spiritual Director at Pius XII Seminary in Brisbane. The gifts that he honed there during this time would serve him well as Archbishop. He could discern people's gifts long before they could, and he could sense the growing issues within our culture long before they became obvious.

He was a student of Canadian Jesuit theologian, Bernard Lonergan, whose work explored dimensions of conversion. Lonergan's deepest stage of conversion was "being in-love" and John Bathersby came to live this level of deep faith —

probably quite unconsciously — in the later years of his public ministry. He became even more captivated by the person of Jesus and the power of the Gospel. He wanted to know the person of Jesus more fully and follow him more whole-heartedly and he wanted the whole archdiocese to go on this journey with him.

He was a man of great fidelity to the Church with the spirituality of a seeker of wisdom and a practical sense of what needed to be done. He was forever shaped by the country air and his early formative years as a priest in the Toowoomba diocese. It was, perhaps, this rural experience that gave him such an ecumenical heart, as he could sense the power of our communion in Christ beyond the ecclesiastical divisions.

His leadership was a great gift to the Archdiocese of Brisbane and we pray now that he will be led through the darkness of death and into the light of Easter Glory. We pray:

*Lead him, kindly Light,  
amid evenings and endings.*

*Lead him on in your mercy through this night  
of death! Lead him on to your bright radiance  
of Life Eternal!*

## ARCHBISHOP EMERITUS JOHN BATHERSBY



The retired Archbishop of Brisbane, John Bathersby, died on Monday March 9, following a recent stroke. Archbishop John led the Archdiocese from 1991 until 2011, retiring upon reaching 75 years of age. The liturgies that will usher Archbishop John into eternal life are being held at the Cathedral with a **Funeral Vigil Liturgy at 5.00pm on Sunday March 15, Morning Prayer for the Dead in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel of the Cathedral at 8 am on Monday morning, and a Solemn Funeral Mass and Rite of Committal at 11.00am on Monday (nb: no public parking available on this business weekday).**

Beyond the parish commitments, Chris has also been the music tutor at Corpus Christi Seminary in Melbourne. Chris is no stranger to cathedral repertoire, having been an organ scholar at St. Patrick's Cathedral in Melbourne. Chris will be a welcome addition to our St. Stephen's community and we look forward to his commencement of duties on 28<sup>th</sup> April.

Amen.*



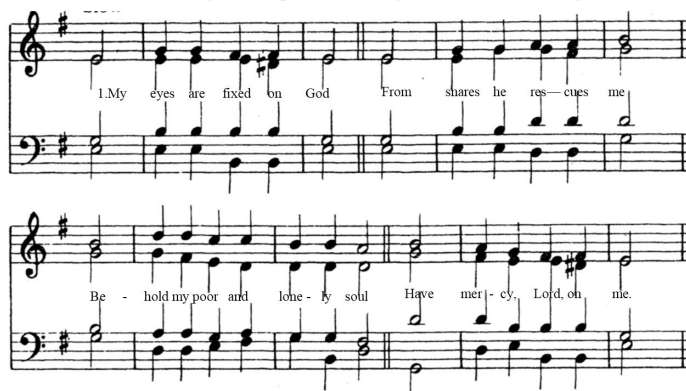
## Music at the 10.00am Solemn Mass

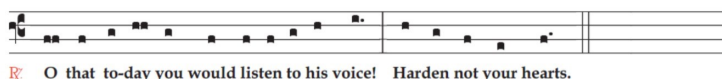



Fridays during Lent between 12.00-1.30pm
