MONDAY 13 APRIL 2020*Monday within the Octave of Easter***ENTRANCE ANTIPHON:**

The Lord has led you into a land flowing with milk and honey, that the law of the Lord may always be on your lips, alleluia.

FIRST READING: Acts 2:14, 22-33**RESPONSORIAL PSALM:**
Ps 15:1-2, 5, 7-11

Preserve me, God, I take refuge in you.
I say to the Lord: 'You are my God.
O Lord, it is you who are my portion and cup;
it is you yourself who are my prize.'
