The community of the Cathedral of St. Stephen acknowledges the traditional custodians of the land on which our parish stands.

Dear friends,

This Sunday goes by a number of different names: the Fourth Sunday of Easter; Good Shepherd Sunday; and the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. For many of us, the daily rhythm of our vocation has changed, even if our fundamental vocation has not. As we live and work differently, we are reminded that we don't "have" a vocation, we *are* a vocation.

In these passed months, we have needed to learn new things: parents have become teachers in the home; pastors have become "performers" on the live stream; grand-parents have adapted to "drive-by" visitations; friends have become virtual companions; our community service has been curtailed; simple tasks have become more complex; all our weekly distractions, like sport or entertainment or going out for a meal, have disappeared; and our prayers have become more personal and domestic even as we pray together.

Even as we miss the simple joys of life, and learn to adjust to new circumstances, we remained committed to the vision of new life that Easter promises. Pope Francis own words on this World Day of Prayer for Vocations are an encouragement to us:

The Gospel tells us that in the midst of this

challenging journey we are not alone. Like the first ray of dawn in the heart of the night, the Lord comes walking on the troubled waters to join the disciples... The first word of vocation is gratitude. Taking the right course is not something we do on our own, nor does it depend solely on the road we choose to travel. How we find fulfilment in life is more than a decision we make as isolated individuals; above all else, it is a response to a call from on high. The Lord points out our destination on the opposite shore and he grants us the courage to board the boat. In calling us, he becomes our helmsman; he accompanies and guides us; he prevents us from running aground on the shoals of indecision and even enables us to walk on surging waters.

Every vocation is born of that gaze of love with which the Lord came to meet us, perhaps even at a time when our boat was being battered by the storm. Vocation, more than our own choice, is a response to the Lord's unmerited call. We will succeed in discovering and embracing our vocation once we open our hearts in gratitude and perceive the passage of God in our lives.

Our vocation is not only about what we *do* in life; it is also about who we *are* in life. Even as we live our vocations differently, we remained called to lives of gratitude, faith and trust.

On the holy mountain is his city cherished by the Lord.

Of you are told glorious things, O city of God!

FIRST READING: Acts 13:13-25**RESPONSORIAL PSALM:**

Ps 88:2-3, 21-22, 25, 27

I will sing for ever of your love, O Lord; through all ages my mouth will proclaim your truth. Of this I am sure, that your love lasts for ever, that your truth is firmly established as the heavens.

I have found David my servant and with my holy oil anointed him. My hand shall always be with him and my arm shall make him strong.

My truth and love shall be with him; by my name his might shall be exalted. He will say to me: 'You are my father, my God, the rock who saves me.'
