The community of the Cathedral of St. Stephen acknowledges the traditional custodians of the land on which our parish stands.

Dear friends,

In the ever-evolving world of Covidsafe compliance, we are now at a stage where we can welcome 100 people into Places of Worship. This, of course, remains dependent upon the continuation of our current trajectory of low numbers of positive cases and observing the requirements of physical distancing and contact tracing.

From **Monday, 15th June**, the Cathedral parish will resume its normal pattern of week day liturgies with the Sacrament of Penance being offered in the Confessionals of the Cathedral. At this stage, all weekday liturgies will be in the Cathedral. These week day liturgy times are in the shaded box below.

Due to the restricted attendance numbers for Sunday Mass our Sunday timetable will be altered until restrictions are lifted. From **Sunday, 21st June** (including the Saturday evenings), our Sunday timetable will be:

Sun: 8am, St. Stephen's

9:30am, Villa Maria* (*residents only)
10am, St. Stephen's
11am, St. Patrick's*
12pm, St. Stephen's

7:30pm, St. Stephen's

Please be aware of our **additional Masses** (Sat:

5pm, St. Patrick's and Sun: 5pm, St. Stephen's) and **changed Mass times** (Sun: 11am, St. Patrick's).

The current contingencies remain in place:

- There is a process of registration for Mass attendance. This is available on-line through the Cathedral website or by calling the Cathedral office (3324 3030). Please do not rely on space being available and registration will ensure that a space is available for you. Registration for Sunday Masses will close at Midday on the Friday prior. The collection of names and contact details is a Government requirement and allows authorities to trace attendees should the need arise;

- Everyone will need to observe physical distancing whilst inside our churches. Measures such as no Communion on the tongue, no Communion from the Cup, and no shaking of hands at the sign of peace remain in place. At this stage, there can be no communal singing. This is new territory for us all and your co-operation and understanding in the implementation of these procedures is greatly appreciated.

Regulations are constantly changing, so please check our website for further developments and updates. On this Feast of Corpus Christi, we are heartened that we can begin the slow process of once again becoming a physical Eucharistic community. We look forward to seeing you all soon. *Fr. Anthony*
