Dear friends,

Once again, one of our special family days is disrupted by border restrictions, quarantined Nursing Homes and limits on how many can gather in the family home. Such is the reality of this year that Father's Day 2020 will be celebrated at a distance for many.

There is a strange confluence in the readings today. Jesus reminds us that limited gatherings are no obstacle to the power of God: "I tell you solemnly once again, if two of you on earth agree to ask anything at all, it will be granted to you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three meet in my name, I shall be there with them." It only takes two or three to spark a wave of grace.

If we find ourselves constantly lamenting what we are missing this year, perhaps we can ask, "What is still possible?" And what is still possible is that we can continue to be a blessing to one another and this is especially true for families. If you can't be physically present to your father today, read him this blessing and open your hearts together to the bonds alive through grace:

Bless those whose lives speak of growing old; Let them know what gentle witnesses they are to us, we who still ponder the meaning of life and growth.

Raise in their hearts a yearning for you which will not cease.

Restrictions for places of worship

Registration for all Masses is essential (especially the Sunday Masses). Registration can be done via the Cathedral website. **Registration for Sunday Mass closes at midday on Friday.** If you do not have the resources to register on-line, please contact us on 3324 3030. **The following guidelines remain in place:**

- If you are feeling unwell, please stay home and participate in Mass on-line via the Cathedral website;
- Physical distancing of 1.5m, whilst standing in the queue to check-in, during Mass and whilst in the Communion procession, is essential;
- Hand hygiene (sanitising your hands before entering the church and when exiting);
- Respiratory hygiene (coughing/sneezing into elbow);
- The number of people in our churches at any one time must be strictly adhered to.
- If you have registered for a particular Sunday Mass but have not checked in by the end of the Processional Hymn, your place may be re-allocated.
