**Lest We Forget**

**Readings for today: Acts 4:8-12; 1 John 3:1-2; John 10:11-18 (Yr B)**

"Peace be with you!" This is the greeting of the resurrected Christ that we hear so often during these weeks of Easter. It's a greeting that we long to hear every day of our lives. This is so often our prayer as we experience brokenness in our personal and family life, when we hear about or encounter domestic and family violence and when we witness on our screens conflicts around the globe. It seems that the entire universe yearns the gift of the Risen One, the gift of peace.

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is known as Good Shepherd Sunday, each year we hear a part of Chapter 10 from the Gospel of John. One of the common and much loved images of Jesus is that of the Good Shepherd, tenderly caring for his flock. The shepherd is one of the earliest images we have of Jesus, found in the catacombs of Priscilla in Rome dating back to the third Century. It's the image Pope Francis choose for his pectoral cross when he was the Archbishop of Buenos Aires and continues to wear as Pope.

Often Jesus is depicted with the shepherd's crook, the symbol used today by bishops as the shepherds of our Christian communities. In the time of Jesus the shepherd stayed with the flock, often in quite dangerous situations. We can imagine the sheep feeling unsettled and frighten in bad weather, when wolves roamed around them or they were

under threat from strangers. The flocks were small so the shepherd, with his long crook, could touch each one individually reassuring them of his presence, his protection.

Today we can imagine the young men of the armed forces at ANZAC Cove, perhaps full of pride and some bravado, but I'm sure with a good measure of fear. We can imagine the medical teams as they cared for the injured and dying, so often under threat themselves. We can imagine the families at home, waiting for news, terrified of the bad news they feared. Into this fear and uncertainty the Good Shepherd was there "with his crook and his staff" to give comfort and reassurance. We can also imagine the Shepherd with the Ottoman Army, he is Shepherd of all.

We all need reassurance from time to time. We all long to feel the Shepherd's touch as we are assailed with the turbulence of life. As we gather today to pray for peace, let us hear the words, "Peace be with you" and feel the touch of resurrection as the good Shepherd nudges us with his crook. And let us commit to be people of peace, shepherding those in our care with the strength and the tenderness of the Good Shepherd.

### CHECK IN AND YOU'RE GOOD TO GO!

Beginning next week, we will be using the new Check In Qld app to help keep you COVID safe the next time you visit.

All you need to do is:

- ✓ visit [www.covid19.qld.gov.au/check-in-qld](http://www.covid19.qld.gov.au/check-in-qld) for links to download the app from Google Play or Apple App stores
- ✓ enter your details once when you first open the app
- ✓ open the app when you next visit us
- ✓ select 'Check in Now' and scan or enter our code

Using this digital check in means your details will be stored securely by the Queensland Government for 56 days to assist with COVID-19 contact tracing (if needed).

The Check In Qld app is safe, secure and private. By using it, you are helping Queensland businesses stay open, and you can visit us with confidence, knowing you can be contacted quickly and easily if there is any risk of exposure to the virus.

For those who don't have a smartphone or aren't comfortable downloading apps, you can register at the door of the church or telephone the Cathedral Office before 12noon on Friday.

### **The following guidelines remain in place:**

- If you are feeling unwell, please stay home and participate in Mass on-line via the Cathedral website;
- Physical distancing of 1.5m, whilst standing in the queue to check-in, during Mass and whilst in the Communion procession, is essential;
- Hand hygiene (sanitising your hands before entering the church and when exiting);
- Respiratory hygiene (coughing/sneezing into elbow);
- The number of people in our churches at any one time must be strictly adhered to.






