SOLEMNITY OF PENTECOST

Year B — 22nd May 2021

The community of the Cathedral of St. Stephen acknowledges the traditional custodians of the land on which our parish stands.

Readings for today: Acts 2:1-11; 1 Corinthians 12:3-7, 12-13; John 15:26-27, 16:12-15

Dear friends,

We are now well into the football season, and regardless of which code you follow, we have a good sense of which teams are playing with "spirit" and those that aren't (not mentioning any names but you know who they are). "Spirit" is one of those elusive qualities that we throw around when we don't know how else to describe attitudes, effort, motivation and energy levels. It is a way of saying that we can't just think our way through a situation or circumstance to create a different outcome; we also need to act by reaching for, or receiving, deeper motivations and sense of vision. "Spirit" and "heart" seem to go together.

We use the term "spirit" in all sorts of ways. We talk about human spirit, or national spirit, or school spirit or community spirit; we talk about being in good spirits, high spirits or our spirits being low. We get told to lift our spirits, we talk of spirited performances on the sporting field, and we get encouraged to show some spirit. Our secular world seems to like speak about spirit quite a lot. It is a recognition that we human beings are more than skin and bone. There is more going on inside us than our

biology. There is more going on in our world than simply one thing after another. The way we use the word "spirit" shows that we have an instinct that there is something much more mysterious going on than we care to admit.

The Holy Spirit is the mysterious sense that inspires us, encourages us, comforts us and strengthens us. As Pope Francis said of Pentecost, "the Spirit made the apostles go forth from themselves and turned them into heralds of God's wondrous deeds, capable of speaking to each person in his or her own language.... Jesus wants followers who proclaim the good news not only with words, but above all by a life transfigured by God's presence."

When we demonstrate that we have a lack of spirit, we are usually heading for defeat of one kind or another. But the Good News is, is that God's Spirit has already been poured into our hearts. God's Holy Spirit waits inside our locked hearts to be re-discovered. And unlocking the heart holds the key to living "a life transfigured by God's presence". So, let us not let the team down, and on this feast, may we be renewed in God's Spirit. *Fr. Anthony*
