*"Quiet now! Be calm!"*

**Readings for today: Job 38:1,8-11; 2 Corinthians 5:14-17; Mark 4:35-41**

Dear friends,

As the consequences of the pandemic were beginning to "sink-in" in March last year, Pope Francis led a time of prayer in a wet and empty St. Peter's Piazza. The images remain evocative and his words still contain a powerful prophetic resonance. The prayer and preaching were based around today's gospel reading: the calming of the storm. Here is an edited version of the words of Pope Francis from 2020:

*"When evening had come". The Gospel passage we have just heard begins like this. For weeks now it has been evening. Thick darkness has gathered over our squares, our streets and our cities; it has taken over our lives, filling everything with a deafening silence and a distressing void, that stops everything as it passes by; we feel it in the air, we notice in people's gestures, their glances give them away. We find ourselves afraid and lost. Like the disciples in the Gospel we were caught off guard by an unexpected, turbulent storm. We have realized that we are on the same boat, all of us fragile and disoriented, but at the same time important and needed, all of us called to row together, each of us in need of comforting the other. On this boat... are all of us. Just like those disciples, who spoke anxiously with one voice, saying "We are perishing" so we too have realized that we cannot go on thinking of ourselves, but only together can we do this. The storm exposes our vulnerability and uncovers*

*those false and superfluous certainties around which we have constructed our daily schedules, our projects, our habits and priorities. It shows us how we have allowed to become dull and feeble the very things that nourish, sustain and strengthen our lives and our communities. The tempest lays bare all our pre-packaged ideas and forgetfulness of what nourishes our people's souls; all those attempts that anesthetize us with ways of thinking and acting that supposedly "save" us, but instead prove incapable of putting us in touch with our roots and keeping alive the memory of those who have gone before us.*

*Faith begins when we realise we are in need of salvation. We are not self-sufficient; by ourselves we founder: we need the Lord, like ancient navigators needed the stars. Let us invite Jesus into the boats of our lives. Let us hand over our fears to him so that he can conquer them. Like the disciples, we will experience that with him on board there will be no shipwreck. Because this is God's strength: turning to the good everything that happens to us, even the bad things. He brings serenity into our storms, because with God life never dies.*

*The Lord awakens so as to our Easter faith. We have an anchor: by his cross we have been saved. We have a rudder: by his cross we have been redeemed. We have a hope: by his cross we have been healed so that nothing and no one can separate us from his redeeming love. Lord, tell us again: "Do not be afraid!"*


### THE END OF PLANNED GIVING ENVELOPES

With shouts of great gladness we praise you, Amen.





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

The 10:00am Solemn Mass is led by the Cathedral Choir, the music for this mass is inside this bulletin.


The 12:00pm Mass is usually led by the Cathedral Schola. All other Masses are led by a cantor.
