THE NATIVITY OF THE LORD CHRISTMAS DAY – 25 December 2021

The community of the Cathedral of St. Stephen acknowledges the traditional custodians of the land on which our parish stands.

Readings for today: Isaiah 9:1-7; Titus 2:11-14; Luke 2:1-14

This year was supposed to be different. We thought by now that the mind-numbing, paralysing effects of plague would be a thing of history. But our present circumstance hasn't become history just yet and we find ourselves once more both burdened and motivated by the demands of collective responsibility.

We jostle and groan at the loss of our freedoms; some resent the voices of power, suspicious of their creeping authority. Others chant something about liberty, and yet many - most respond readily to public exhortation.

Even so, all of us struggle to recognise the world in which we now live. *Is this really Christmas 2021?*

Yes it is. The feast of the Nativity is never an escape from reality, from what is really real. And what is really real is now. The first weeks of Advent are all about waking-up — becoming awake and staying awake. So now is not the time to go back to sleep; to be lost in the dreams that we wish were true or trapped in the nightmares which we most fear. Christmas is about being glad that we are awake; our senses seized by a real God who is alive in this real world.

If we have heard the Advent call and arisen from the fatigue of uncertainty, then these last two years have been a chance to discover good health; to learn about the things that make us well in body, mind and spirit and to let go of the things which are beyond our control, and find joy in simpler, humbler ways. So perhaps there can be more than one person who is making a list and checking it twice this Christmas. What has this seemingly never-ending roller-coaster ride taught you about living well and authentically? Make a list.

When God came in the flesh to make this world well, God also came with lessons to teach us, with instructions to follow. This Teacher and Healer taught us where to look for God (among the weak, the left behind, the wounded); how to be human (be humble, be generous, be compassionate); and what to hope for and trust in (life, new life, and eternal life). If the last two years have *left you battled scarred by reality,* then the promise of Christmas is for you. God comes because this world, and we, the human family who inhabit it, have a great need. We need rescuing by a real God who chooses to risk everything for our sake.




