Solemnity of St Stephen, Protomartyr December 26, 2021

The community of the Cathedral of St. Stephen acknowledges the traditional custodians of the land on which our parish stands.

Readings for today: Acts 6:8-10; 7:54-59; Psalm 30; Matthew 10:17-22

ST STEPHEN, PROTOMARTYR

Saint Stephen, (died c. AD 36, Jerusalem), First Christian martyr.

As told in the Acts of the Apostles, he was a foreign-born Jew who lived in Jerusalem and joined the church at an early date. He was one of seven deacons appointed by the Apostles to care for elderly women, widows, and orphans.

As a Hellenised Jew, he was strongly opposed to the Temple cult of Judaism. For expressing his opposition, he was brought before the Sanhedrin. His defence of Christianity so outraged his hearers that he was condemned to be stoned to death. One of those who assented to the execution was Saul of Tarsus (later Saint Paul).

His final words, a prayer of forgiveness for his attackers (Acts 7:60), echo those of Jesus on the cross (Luke 23:34). Stephen is the patron saint of deacons and stonemasons.
