Dear friends,

Is the world becoming an angrier place? In the gospel, Jesus plays to his toughest Is rage - or "outrage" - becoming a pandemic? I'm not sure if the world is becoming angrier but it does seem that hiding to nothing. He is lucky to get out expressing your wrath at another's opinion or ideas is routine. It is not enough to simply disagree: we must unacceptable "enraged" become at comment, opinion and actions and we must let the whole world know.

The fact that Jesus is caught-up in such outrage today shows us that this is not a new phenomenon. Nevertheless, it could be a story from today's headlines. Israel and Palestine are such tense, volatile regions that it is not hard to imagine a 30year-old man being dragged from a local synagogue by an angry and aggrieved mob and thrown off the nearest cliff. Not much has changed in two thousand years, but it's not just Israel and Palestine where hatred is a currency; it exists in every part of the world.

But we still dare to speak about the promise of love in such an angry, violent world. Paul's great hymn about "Love" sits in-between the two forceful and confronting stories of Jeremiah and Jesus. Jeremiah is told to go and speak God's Word regardless of the cost and regardless of people's response. This role of the prophet will lead Jeremiah into great suffering.

crowd, his hometown, and even before he says a word, he knows that he is on a alive.

In the middle of it all, Paul whistles away about love. Perhaps this says something about the glue that holds us all together. For all of life's hardships and sufferings, for all of its tensions and dramas, for all of its rejections and hurts, for all of our moments of being harmed and doing harm to one another, for all of our anger and rage, we still place our greatest hope in this crazy little thing called love.

St. Paul provides us with a list of love's Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) today: patience; kindness; it is free of jealousy, conceit, and pride; it is not rude, selfish or resentful; and love trusts to the end. How are you going against such a checklist? Perhaps ask your loved-ones and see what they think.

We might live in an "age of rage", but that isn't what keeps the world turning. What matters is not only the fire in the belly but also the flame in the heart. Love, at it is most gracious, is what sustains all human relationships, and human society its self. Without people who are patient and kind, free of jealousy, conceit and pride, who are not rude or selfish, this world becomes a desert. *Fr. Anthony*


"Spirit of Hope" City Monthly Prayer Meeting
