> St. Paul's hope-filled image is not a glib remedy for our real fears of death or the anguished grief of separation, but the power of the insistent and gentle promise whispered in the midst of life's darkness. These are not the sentimental utterances which reduce people's "eternity" to the length of our memory or the space of our hearts. This is about what God intends for every human being: a life freed from decay and finitude, gifted with a "body" transformed by the power of Love and Life. Who knows what this transfiguring will look like or feel like but it remains our hope, not crafted in fantasy, but fashioned by trust that the compass of the human heart knows precisely where to find our fulfilment.



All glory to the Father, Son, And to the Holy Spirit be; As from the first it was, is now, And will be for eternity.






