Readings for today: Joshua 5:9-12; 2 Corinthians 5:17-21; Luke 15:1-3, 11-32

Rejoice Jerusalem

rejoice.

"Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who are in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast."

We are invited to pause on the journey of Lent and celebrate what God has done, what God is doing and will continue to do in our midst.

We are also called to remember. In today's first reading from the Book of Joshua the Israelites have just entered the Promised Land. Moses has died and Joshua has been appointed by God as the leader of Israel. The entry into the land has not been easy, to continue to dwell in the land will be even more difficult, but at this point in the story there is a pause, it's time to celebrate Passover. They look back to when God freed them from the slavery of Egypt, parted the waters, led them through the dry sea and promised them a land flowing with milk and honey. And so, as they cross over to the Promised Land they pause to reflect and rejoice. This is a new beginning in the history of the people of Israel.

Today's entrance antiphon calls us to Jesus assures us in the Gospel of today (Luke 15: 11-32) that, unworthy as we might be, we are not God's slaves, not God's hired help, we are God's daughters and sons. St Paul, in the second reading (2 Cor 5:17-21), assures us that we are a new creation in Christ.

> As we look around the world we can feel the despair of war and destruction, we are overwhelmed by the magnitude of the floods and other natural disasters, and we can be paralysed by personal situations in our lives in which there seems no answer, no light. However invitation is to pause, to look back and recognise the power of God in our own journey and to, in the words of the Responsorial Psalm, "Taste and see the goodness of the Lord."

> As you pause today what new stirrings do you recognise within you, what new ways is God opening for you? What new ways is God opening for the Church? What new ways is God opening for the human family?

> Let us all spend sometime today to pause and rejoice!

Jerusalem: within your walls The thrones of justice serve God's will; The ancient thrones of David's house Stand and unite God's people still.


