Each year, our Lenten journey begins on Ash Wednesday reminding us that through the three pillars of prayer, fasting and almsgiving, we mentally and physically prepare our hearts and minds for the joy of the Resurrection of Our Lord at Easter. This journey in the wilderness is some forty days of rediscovery and resetting our lives in anticipation of a truly joyous occasion.

The restraint has been very evident liturgically as we come to Mass over the past few Sundays, and will appear even more so as we enter into Passiontide, this final stage before Holy Week: flowers removed, the Church's ancient song of praise (the Gloria) omitted, vestments of violet or rose have been worn, the organ is restricted in its playing to supporting the singing (many of our Masses have indeed ended in silence), and in some places, images of the saints and crucifixes are also covered over, allowing their glory to be declared in the joy of the Resurrection.

Did you notice all these changes that have taken place over the past few weeks? Coming to Mass is a true feast of the senses, so keep your eyes (and ears!) attuned for other small changes in our formal worship in lead-up to the unbridled joy of Easter.

Then, on Easter Night, as the Light which breaks through the darkness enters our lives, our hearts and our minds, all these items which reveal the beauty, wonder and Glory of God are again returned to us!

Well... not everything unfortunately this Easter. Sitting at the centre of our worshipping life at the Cathedral (visually as well as aurally!) is the famed Jubilee Pipe Organ, built by Danish-Australian master craftsman Knud Smenge in 2000. Visually imposing above the Sanctuary, we are blessed to have such a striking, impressive instrument lead and enhance our worship. It truly expresses the full gamut of human emotion through the power of music.

Many of you are aware our pipe organ suffered severe damage during the recent deluge of a few weekends ago. It will again be out of operation for some months for urgent repairs, and its glory will not be able to lead and inspire ours in proclaiming the Resurrection of our Saviour, Jesus Christ throughout the Easter Season this year.

We launch this week a 'Notes for Notes' campaign to get our Jubilee Pipe Organ playing again. All donations great and small go towards bringing the organ's 'joy' back to our worshipping life here at the Cathedral. If you are in a position to make a financial contribution, please leave an envelope marked 'Notes for Notes' in the collection plate, or please contact the Cathedral Office.

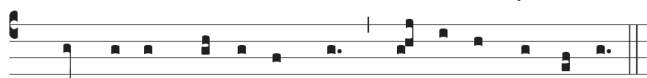

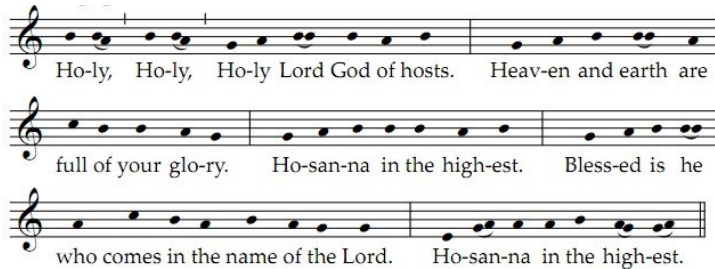

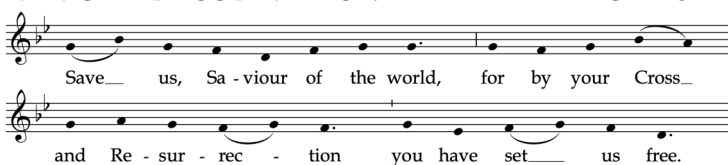

The 12:00pm Mass is today led by the Cathedral Chorale. All other Masses are led by a cantor.

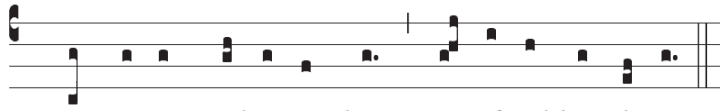
