Readings for today: Acts 5:27-32, 40-41; Revelation 5:11-14; John 21:1-19

Dear friends,

Holy Water is back in the fonts (just as an aside, this makes it more important to continue to use the hand sanitiser! But back to the Holy Water...). The Holy Water serves as a reminder of our baptism. We are not blessing ourselves because we are entering a sacred space (which we are), we are blessing ourselves because we are entering a sacred space as baptised people. This is our sacred space.

In baptism, we all share an equal dignity before God, and, by dipping our hands in the font, and touching our head, heart and shoulders, we are recognising that baptism makes a difference in our lives. It makes a difference to how we think (head); it makes a difference to how we love (heart); and makes a difference to how we work and live (shoulders). This sacred space is where we celebrate, cultivate and strengthened our baptismal life. So after two long years, we can feel the water of new life again and in doing so, give thanks that we are called to live the new life of the resurrection. So, let our sign of the Cross not be a reflex action but a thoughtful and thankful one.

And we don't just bless ourselves when we come *into* the sacred space. We also bless ourselves as we leave. That's not because we are "leaving" the church building, because we are "entering", or more to the point "re-entering" the world that we are called to service as God's pilgrim people. So the blessing on our departure isn't a "signing-off" gesture but in reality a "signing-on" gesture. We are going back out into the world, recognising, once again, that we are baptised people. Out in the world, we will encounter the God has called into our baptismal lives, and God has done so, not merely for our own sake but so that the world itself might come to the know the Good News of the Risen Christ.

Most of our faith-life is lived beyond the walls of the church but we return to take a plunge in the fountain of new life. We enter, claiming the power of our baptism, knowing that the house of God is our house but, like any house, we must leave to do the daily work of discipleship amid the ordinariness of the world. No wonder we need a refreshing dip. *Fr. Anthony*

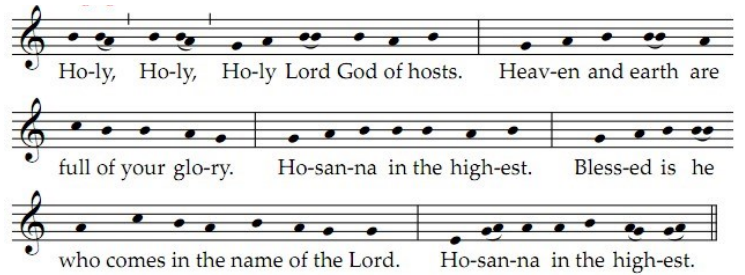

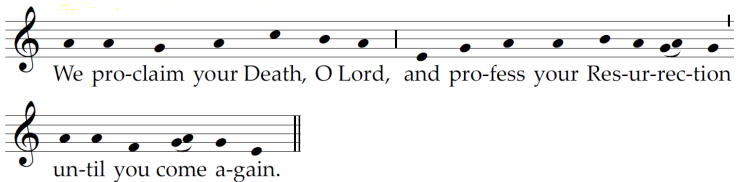
