FOURTH SUNDAY of EASTER

Year $C - 8^{th}$ May 2022

The community of the Cathedral of St. Stephen acknowledges the traditional custodians of the land on which our parish stands.

Readings for today: Acts 13:14, 43-52; Revelation 7:9, 14-17; John 10:27-30

"Arise, then... women of this day! Arise, all joy, was a day born out of the pains of women who have hearts, whether our war and of loss. In this regard Mother's baptism be that of water or of tears! Say Day has a paschal quality. The joy of firmly... Our husbands shall not come to Easter too is born out of pain - the pain us, reeking with carnage, for caresses and of the cross. applause. Our sons shall not be taken from us to unlearn all that we have been able to teach them of charity, mercy and patience... let women now leave all that may be left of home for a great and earnest day of council....Let them meet first, as women, to bewail and commemorate the dead. Let them then solemnly take council with each other as to the means whereby the great human family can live in peace, each bearing after [their] own kind the sacred impress, not of Caesar, but of God.

These are extracts from the *Appeal to* Womanhood Throughout the World. The call to action was written around 1870 by Julia Ward Howe a pacifist and suffragette who witnessed firsthand the horrors of the American civil war, when tending to soldiers and orphans. Howe envisioned a global day for women to gather locally to discuss and promote peace. Among her fellow activists was Ann Reeves Jarvis. It was Jarvis' daughter who campaigned for the Mother's Day we know today to broadly honour her mother's memory and mothers generally. Thus a day of Happy Mother's Day.

Jesus Christ in his life and in suffering, made present to us the motherhood of God. Blessed Pope John Paul I said that "[God] is our father; even more [God] is our mother. [God] does not want to hurt us, [God] wants only to do good to us, to all of us. If children are ill, they have additional claim to be loved by their mother. And we too, if by chance we are sick with badness, on the wrong track, have yet another claim to be loved by the Lord". I would add that mothers too make present in their vocation, the care of God.

Despite its pastoral imagery, today's gospel is pregnant with glimpses of divine motherhood in its protectiveness, its knowledge of those in Christ's care, his determination to nurture them, his determination to guard them. He might as well have said "My children listen to my voice", "I know them and they follow me", "they will never be lost and no one will ever steal them from me".



Goodness and mercy all my life shall surely follow me; and in God's house for ever more my dwelling place shall be.






