Readings for today: Acts 14:21-27; Revelation 21:1-5; John 13:31-35

Archbishop Mark Coleridge

Last Wednesday marked the tenth anniversary of the Liturgical Installation of Archbishop Mark as Archbishop of Brisbane. And what a ten years it has been! We have come to know him as a preacher and a teacher. His biblical scholarship, love of language and insightful commentary has nurtured our faith and challenges us in our daily living as missionary disciples.

Just eight months after Archbishop Mark's arrival the Catholic world woke to the news that Pope Benedict XVI had resigned. Two weeks later on March 13th, 2013 Pope Francis was elected Bishop of Rome. When Evangelii Gaudim (The Joy of the Gospel), Pope Francis's first Apostolic Exhortation, was published in November that year Archbishop Mark embraced it with enthusiasm. In his Easter Pastoral message he wrote,

"The joy of the Gospel fills the hearts and the lives of those who encounter Jesus": with these words, Pope Francis begins his Apostolic Exhortation, The Joy of the Gospel, which I want to be the charter of the Archdiocese of Brisbane as we shape the future that Jesus wants.

Along with the freshness and challenge of the culture of encounter and evangelisation just a year later came the confronting painful truth of the Royal Commission into Institutional Response to Sexual Abuse. Archbishop Mark led us and, as President of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference, the Church in Australia, through these dark days always with the unwavering belief that it is only by dying that we know the truth of resurrection.

This belief has led Archbishop Mark to being one of the architects of the Plenary Council setting the Church in Australia on the path of synodality.

No-one predicted the events of 2020, however the Archdiocese responded quickly to ensure the faith of the People of God was nourished as best as possible. Many of you experienced great comfort as you watched via livestreaming Archbishop Mark, in an empty cathedral, celebrating the Easter Triduum. On Easter Sunday that year he reminded us that Jesus Christ is the light that no darkness, even the darkness of death, can overcome.

My personal lasting memory of Archbishop Mark comes from the homily he preached at his installation. About Jesus he said,

"He is the Lord crucified and risen who is here and now, or nowhere and never. He is among us as presence and power; and the encounter with him is the very heart of the Christian life and of the Church's mission."

So as we thank God for the gift of our Archbishop, we too pray for his ministry among us in the years ahead, and we commit ourselves anew to the life and mission of the Gospel.

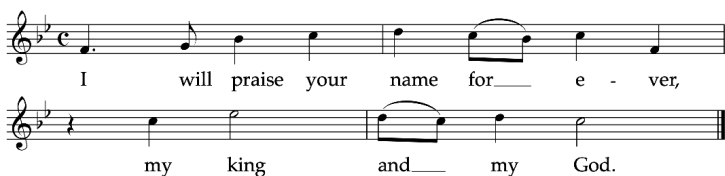

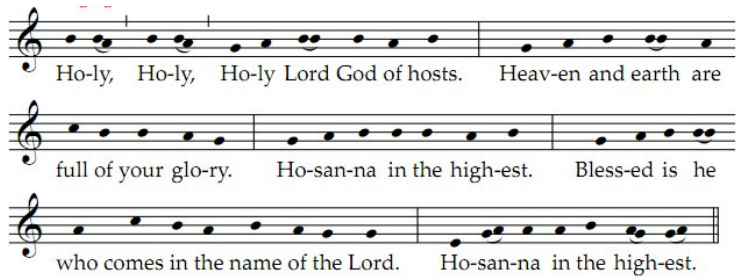

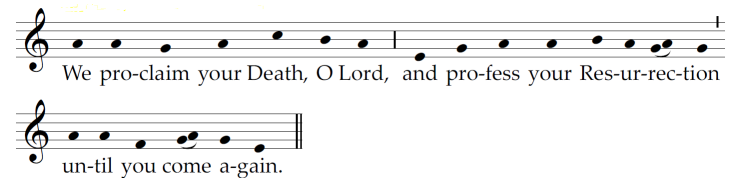
