Dear Friends


Today, as we do every Sunday, the church looks towards the Trinity. The Trinity is, in essence, the singular community of love who gives birth to all things, who holds in merciful tenderness all things, and who renews and embraces all things as our final home. The life of the Trinity is the birthplace of all human communities: of families, of friends, of villages, of cities, of nations, for the Trinity is the DNA and model of every community and the integral ecology of every natural and social bond and partnership. The reason we speak of the dignity and equality of all human beings is because each and every one of us has been brought forth from this community of love that we call the Trinity and have been made in its likeness.

The Trinity is one of the most central doctrines of the Church, but one that we have difficulty explaining and understanding. In fact, this teaching of the Church was never meant to be an explanation, less still "understood" in the conventional sense, but was intended as an expression – a way of saying something without presuming that it was possible to say everything.

Our Christian experience, through our encounter with the person of Jesus in history and our encounter of the Holy Spirit through faith, has come to acknowledge that there is a plurality in this One God: the Father is not the Son, and the Son is not the Father, and the Spirit is neither the Son or the Father, so we speak of three. But as St. Augustine asked, "Three what?" He went on to explain: "The formula three persons was coined, not in order to give a complete explanation, but in order that we might not be obliged to remain silent."

We use human words to express the mystery of our experience of salvation in God. And so, the Church has always followed the hardest path in order to try to say something about the mystery of God. There are countless ways of expressing the mystery of the Trinity (think of St. Patrick and the shamrock, or St. Augustine and his image of the sun, the light and the sunrays), but they all have one necessary element – the Trinity is about relationship. And being part of this relationship is our ultimate future.

These celebrations will take place at Masses next week, June 18/19, the feast of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.


Please continue to pray for these children and their families that they will grow in understanding and love of the Eucharist.




