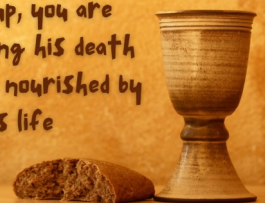

Annual NAIDOC Mass

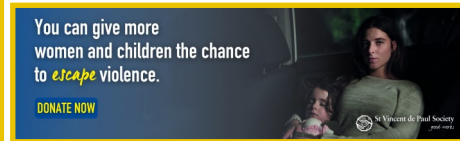
