

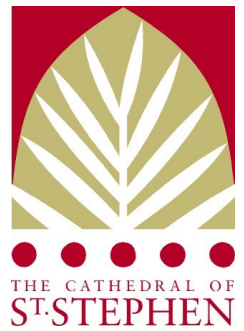
# Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear friends,

In recent months, you might have noticed an increase in the number of homeless people around the Cathedral precinct. These numbers have grown throughout the course of this year. This has raised questions for many of us about the need for an appropriate response taking into account two tensions: our responsibility to those in need and our obligations to maintain a safe and healthy environment and public space. The issues creating these current circumstances are complex and are exacerbated by a number of factors: the pandemic; the floods; lack of available shelters and reduction in resources; and the economic pressures.

In light of this emerging situation, we have contacted a number of homelessness services and they have responded with regular visits to the precinct to conduct welfare checks. We are also in regular communication with the police who have added daily patrols to ensure the safety of all within the precinct and monitor any behaviours which are endangering the safety of the individuals themselves or the public.

Witnessing people living in such vulnerable circumstances at our front door can be confronting and distressing. It both highlights and personalises the uncertain times in which we are living. Jesus is clear about our responsibilities to others and teach us that we see him in the face of those most in need. This does not diminish our responsibilities to ensure that the safety, well-being and protection of all who are part of our precinct community, especially those who visit here regularly. Nevertheless, the reality is that there are no quick, simple or easy solutions.

Mostly, the homeless in the precinct are well behaved and keep to themselves. Occasionally, for various reasons, situations may arise which are unsettling. If you feel concerned at any stage, please notify one of the sacristans or priests. Let us pray for a spirit of practical wisdom, compassion and justice as we accompany those in need and support one another in our daily commitment as disciples of Jesus.

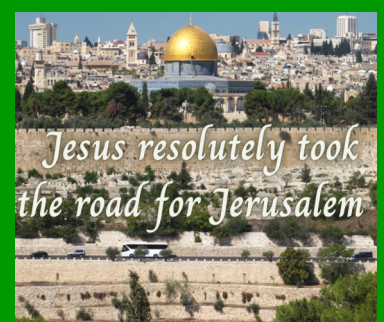

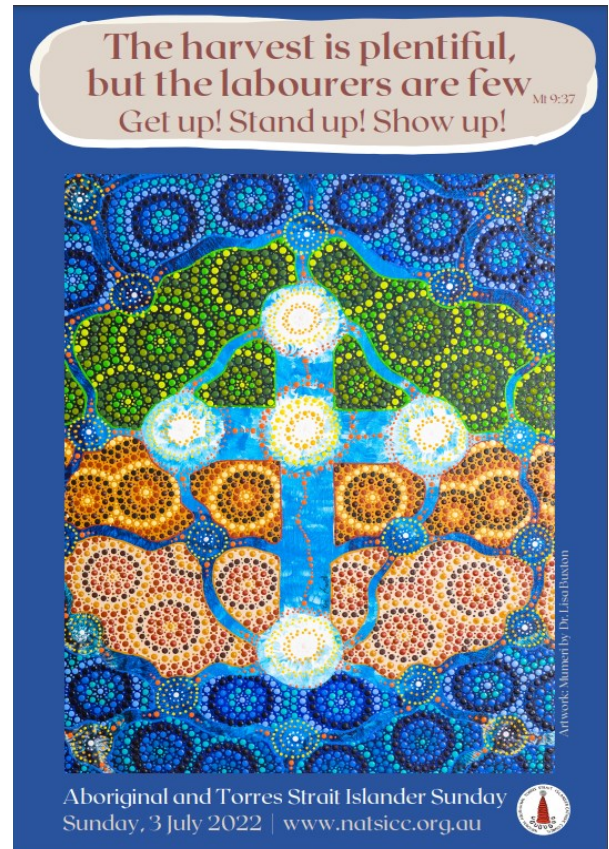

And honour him alone.

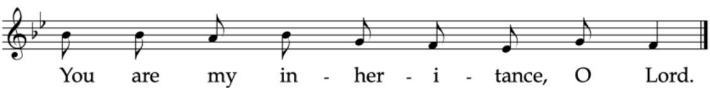
