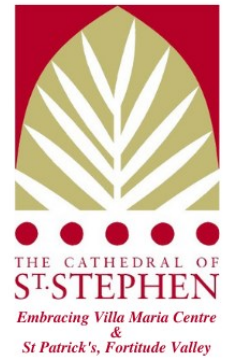


FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear friends,

During the past week, the Australian Bureau of Statistics released the first batch of data from last year's census. Grabbing the headlines was the diminishing number of those who identified as Christian (44 per cent, down from 52 per cent five years earlier and 61 per cent a decade ago). In contrast, there is an increase in those who do not identify with any religious tradition (39 per cent, up from 30 per cent in 2016 and almost double the 22 per cent who ticked the "no religion" box in 2011). The proportion of Australians identifying as Catholic declined from 23 to 20 per cent, the second census in a row where the Catholic population has diminished in percentage terms. While the numbers are clear and come as no surprise, the trends over the last decade make for stark and sobering reading.

This coming week, the second assembly of the Plenary Council will gather in Sydney. A number of us from the Archdiocese of Brisbane will be attending this national gathering. We come together at a crucial time in the history of the Catholic Church in Australia. Statistics are one thing, but they do not describe the condition and

dimensions of the "soul of Australia" about which I am more buoyant than the raw figures suggest. The Church and the gospel still have much to offer our society, and my prayer is that this assembly will help us take a bold and positive step to help build a bridge with Australian culture, which remains a culture still seeking meaning and quietly exploring its spiritual horizons. There remains the prospect of speaking about of the things that make us most human and to name what inspires us to live good lives. We have the chance to enter into the hard work of healing the wounds of history and steadily make peace with the land. We have the opportunity to strengthen the foundations of our common good, and to discover the language and create the images that express our profound connection to the mystery, beauty and wonder of this continent. So at this pivotal time, I ask you to pray for the work of the Plenary Council this week and journey with us as we open ourselves to the promptings of the Holy Spirit:

Come, Holy Spirit of Pentecost.

Come, Holy Spirit of the great South Land.

Amen.

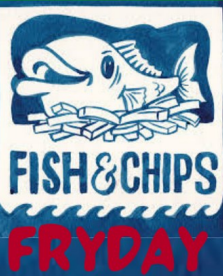

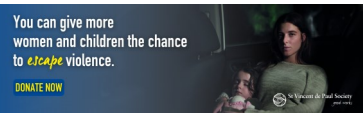

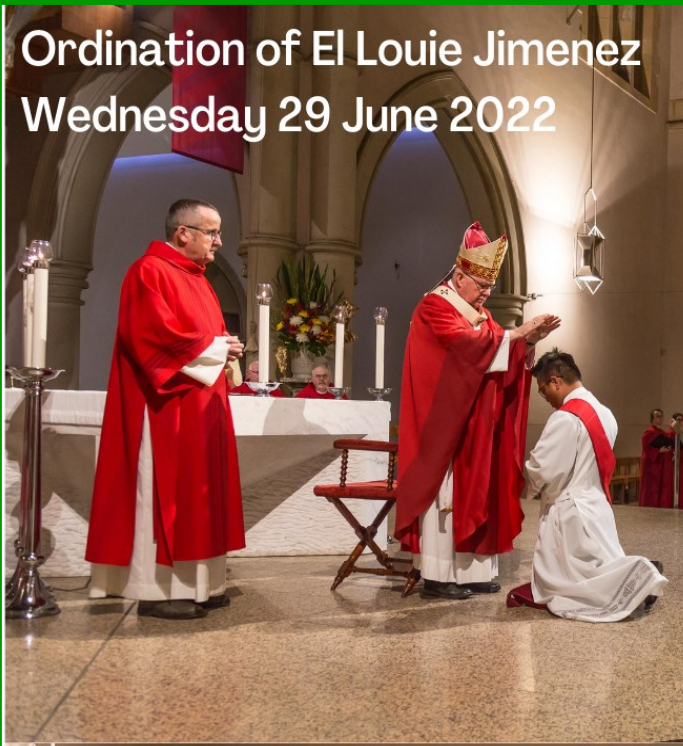
