Dear Friends,

Following a couple of years absence due to COVID-19, this year we welcome the EKKA festival back in Brisbane. This event is very famous among Queenslanders, so much so that some said you are not Queenslanders, if you haven't gone to the EKKA! The EKKA is a home to Queenslanders. With a number of activities involving many people, organisations and even farming animals, the EKKA brings the city and the country together to share the richness of this land and to maintain the tradition of our local custom. More than a show, the EKKA is a celebration: of agriculture, of thanksgiving, and of life.

To some extent, some characters of the EKKA festival also occur in the Eucharist, our source of life. Like the EKKA for Queenslanders, Eucharist forms and strengthens our identity as Catholics. It gathers everyone to the same place, listen to the same Gospel, and share the same joy. Eucharist is also a celebration of life and thanksgiving for all the blessings we receive from God. However, unlike the EKKA, in the Eucharist we have Jesus as the central figure and fountain of God's love. He gathers us around the table to hear His words and share the heavenly banquet with Him.

In today's gospel, Jesus calls his disciples to be watchful and vigilant in preparing themselves for the coming of the Kingdom of God and the final judgement. Along with other passages in the gospel which address the theme of the end of time, today's gospel was written under strong perceptions among the early believers of the imminent second coming of Jesus.

However, this warning is not intended to frighten us! Rather it calls us to always live out our faith consistently, and therefore, we are always ready to welcome God and do His will.

The calling to be watchful and vigilant is an opportunity for us to see how our faith is expressed in our daily lives, for example, making time to go to a Mass. We are called to be vigilant and to live out the Eucharist so that it won't become a routine and withoutsoul-activity. We are called to be vigilant by not seeing the Eucharist as a mere a show with priests and ministers performing their part, while we are passively watching. We are called to be watchful to see the Eucharist as a gift and a moment of transformation. It is never only for our spiritual gain, but it must bring good fruits to our neighbours. The Eucharist transforms us to be an inclusive Church that promote collaboration with others in building a better world. It makes the Church a home for everyone.

Just like the EKKA is a home for all the Queenslanders, we hope to make our Church and community a home for all who thirst for God and long to meet Him. Lastly, I also want to say thank you to all people of the Cathedral of St Stephen, St Patrick's Fortitude Valley, and St Joseph's Kangaroo Point and St Benedict's East Brisbane, who made me feel at home in Brisbane for the past 5.5 years. You all have enriched my life.

To God, the Triune One, we raise Eternal songs of joyful praise, O Father, Son, and Paraclete, We praise your name in word and deed.


