

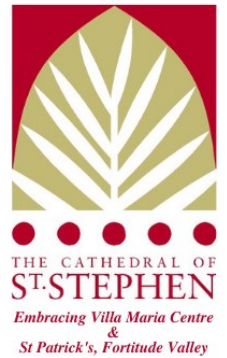

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The burning bush is the Symbol for the Season of Creation 2022. Today, the prevalence of unnatural fires are a sign of the devastating effects that climate change has on the most vulnerable of our planet. Human greed, desertification and land misuse lead to the disintegration of ecosystems, the destruction of habitats, and the loss of livelihoods and species at an alarming rate. Creation cries out as forests crackle, animals flee, and people are forced to migrate due to the fires of injustice that we have caused.

On the contrary, the fire that called to Moses as he tended the flock on Mt. Horeb did not consume or destroy the bush. This was a flame of the Spirit that revealed God's life sustaining presence. This holy fire affirmed that God heard the cries of all who suffered, and promised to be with us as we followed faithfully to deliverance from injustice.



Pope Francis issued a message for the World Day of Prayer for Care of Creation on September 1. His message for 2022 is available on the Season of Creation website: seasonofcreation.org. A quote from the Pope's message will be shared on each of the five Sundays during the Season of Creation

The sweet song of creation invites us to practise an "ecological spirituality" (Laudato Si', 216), attentive to God's presence in the natural world. It is a summons to base our spirituality on the "loving awareness that we are not disconnected from the rest of creatures, but joined in a splendid universal communion" (ibid., 220).

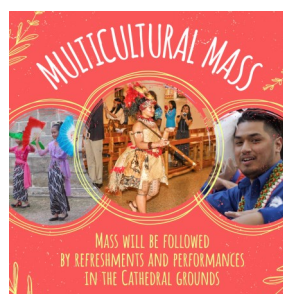

To be obeyed with diligence.

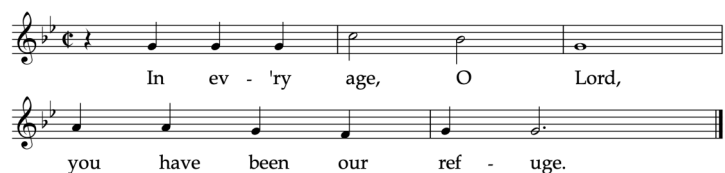

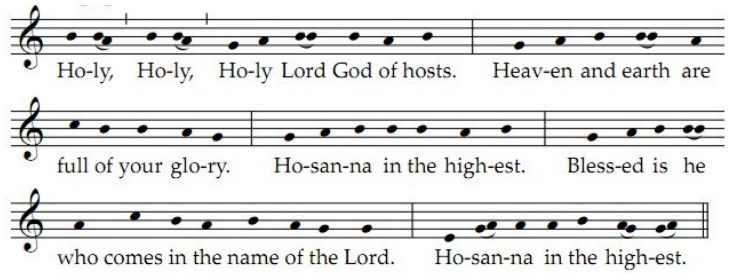

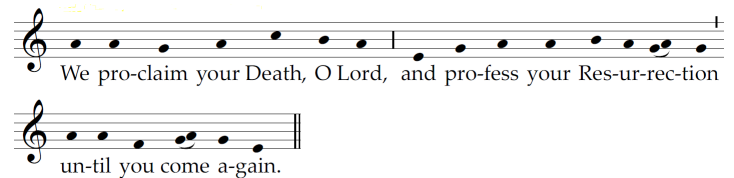

The 10:00am Solemn Mass is led by the Cathedral Choir, the music for this Mass is inside this bulletin.


The Midday Mass is today led by the Cathedral Chorale. All other Masses are led by a cantor.


