

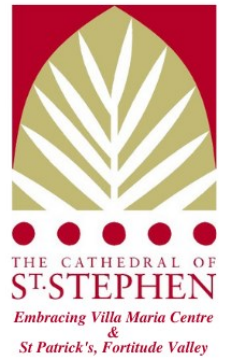

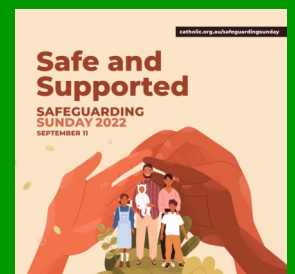

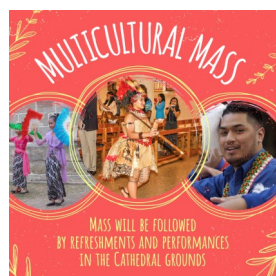


SEASON OF CREATION 2022

The Burning Bush

The Pope's quote on the Season of Creation for 11 September. *For the followers of Christ in particular, this luminous experience reinforces our awareness that "all things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being" (Jn 1:3). 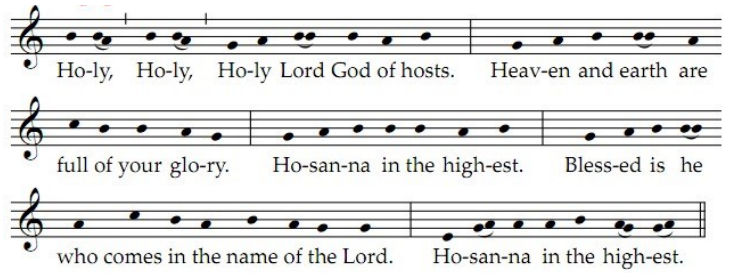

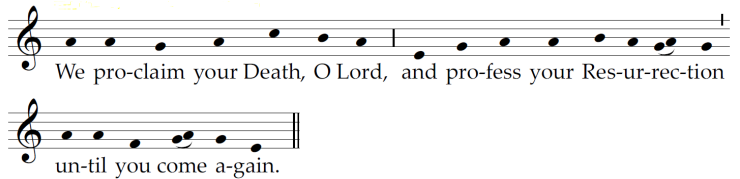
