Dear friends,

"My advice is that, first of all, there should be prayers offered for everyone - petitions, intercessions and thanksgiving - and especially for kings and others in authority, so that we may be able to live religious and reverent lives in peace and quiet."

These are the words of St. Paul to Timothy and we hear them at the start of the second reading this Sunday. As always, the Word of God has something to say directly to our particular moment. At St. Paul's urging, we pray for kings, queens and those in authority so that the human community, especially the community of the faithful, can worship in freedom and live in peace. In a more pronounced way than purely secular rulers, the Sovereign of the United Kingdom also carries the designation of "Defender of the Faith and Supreme Governor of the Church of England". This sovereignty has a religious dimension which is ritualised in through anointing by the Archbishop of Canterbury during the Coronation. King Charles III will live out his duties, secular and religious, in vastly different age to his mother, Queen Elizabeth II.

So much has been said about the long reign of Elizabeth II that it is unnecessary to add anything further. Nevertheless, hearing the words of St. Paul in our liturgical context prompts a consideration of our response as a religious community. The monarchy is our political system and establishes the structures and institutions of our daily life. This is essentially why St. Paul commends the role of prayer in maintaining the freedom and good ordering of society. "It is right" to do this he says, and sketches a broad vision of the role of authority in living out the promise of our salvation rather than focusing on the person or popular adulation of celebrity.

The historical role of the British Crown in fostering religious freedom has not always been glorious, whether among our Catholic ancestors or indigenous spiritualities. Even so, we honour the life, service and faith of Elizabeth II and pray that she will be crowned with the gift of God's mercy and receive the rewards of a good and faithful servant. May Charles III, in inheriting the Crown, also inherit his mother's dedication and fidelity. *Fr. Anthony*

The Pope's quote on the Season of Creation for 18 September.



Prey to our consumerist excesses, she weeps and implores us to put an end to our abuses and to her destruction. Then too, there are all those different creatures who cry out. At the mercy of a "tyrannical anthropocentrism" (Laudato Si', 68), completely at odds with Christ's centrality in the work of creation, countless species are dying out and their hymns of praise silenced.

Thus children learn from history's light To hope in God, walk in his sight, His ordinances to obey, Unlike their ancestors, who strayed.






