Dear friends,

The rich man in this week-end's gospel is trapped. He is trapped and isolated in his rich existence and then even more trapped and isolated in his despairing existence after he dies. Even in death, he thinks that he can still order Lazarus around; no wonder he remains held in a kind of hell. The man has no name, but only an adjective, 'the rich man'; while the name of the poor man is repeated five times. 'Lazarus' means 'God helps'.

Lazarus, lying at the gate, is a living reminder to the rich man to remember God, but the rich man does not receive this reminder. The rich man is not condemned because of his wealth, but for being incapable of feeling compassion for Lazarus and for not coming to his aid. The parable continues to refer to him as "the rich man" even after his death. That is all he is – "rich". He remains trapped in his riches as much in death as in life. He seems unable to escape from his own shortsightedness.

Our materialistic, consumeristic culture produces winners and losers. For every rich man, there is at least a hundred Lazaruses.

No matter what we think of our personal financial situation, whether we count ourselves rich or not, within the global situation, we are. We have access to food, clean water, housing, education and health care, most of us know how to read and write and have a pretty good chance of having a secure future. Most in our world do not, some in our nation do not. We only need to look out the window to find Lazarus feeding off the world's left overs.

Being a disciple means re-ordering our personal priorities, so that global priorities might also be re-ordered. It means noticing the many Lazaruses and doing something about it. This parable isn't really about money; it's about people and who stirs our compassion and how we respond. Like Lazarus, our hope is that we too might be carried away by the angels. *Fr. Anthony*

Fake Cathedral website and emails

There has been an increase in the number of social media accounts that have been set up to look like / impersonate the accounts of church leadership across Australia, including leaders from the Archdiocese of Brisbane. Please be vigilant in checking who you are receiving messages from on social media platforms. Do not engage or respond to messages received on social media unless you are certain of the sender.

It would be helpful to us if you might consider "block and reporting" this account. If a number of people "block and report" accounts which are set up to appear to be a member of our leadership it will increase the likelihood that these copycat profiles will be reviewed by the platform.

- You can report fake facebook accounts by clicking the "3
 dots" on the right hand side of the profile, under the
 "message" button. Then select "Find support or report",
 then select "Fake account" and "submit".
- You can report fake Instagram accounts either via the app or via desktop by clicking on the "3 dots" in the top right section under the main task bar. Then select "Report", then "Report account", "It's pretending to be someone else", "Someone I know", then "Submit" and finally "Close". (n.b if someone you know has sent you the fake link via email or text then you must have an established Instagram account in order for the link work and directly access the fake page for "reporting.
- Twitter's process for reporting an account impersonating someone can be found at https://help.twitter.com/en/safety-and-security/report-twitter-impersonation

It is important to note that these accounts are set up programmatically and it will be like a game of "whack-amole". It's highly possible that as each account which is impersonated is removed, it will be replaced by another and another and another.






