



Dear friends,

The 2021 Census revealed that the Australian community shows much religious diversity in our culture. Christianity continued to be the most common of the religious groups, by far, comprising 43.9 per cent of the population, a decrease from 52.1 per cent in the 2016 Census. Australians identifying with non-Christian religions grew from 8.2 per cent of the population in 2016 to 10 per cent in 2021. The percentage of Australians not identifying with any religious group continued to grow, and in 2021 made up 38.9 per cent of the population, up from 30.1 per cent in 2016.

When viewed from one perspective, Christian faith can seem to be wilting on the vine but statistics never tell the full story. These figures count those who identify as "Christian" and that is all it is – a statistical survey. These figures are an important indicator but they are not the only one. "Faith" is more than a head-count. Faith is also a "heart-count" drawing on something greater than cultural identifiers.

So how would we measure the mustard seed-sized faith that Jesus puts such emphasis on this week-end?

When the apostles ask for an increase in faith, Jesus responds with: "Were your faith the size of a mustard seed you could say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you." The hyperbole is obvious here but the sentiment is not.

When it comes to faith, God does most of the work. Faith can never be forced or demanded; it can only be received as a gift. Like a seed that grows, faith matures over time and by its own rhythms. The census does not count those people who have a sense that there is something more to life and seek some ultimate meaning to our existence. Rather, the role of the census is to assess categories of religious denominations, and these days, most people's faith doesn't fit into neat traditional categories. All faith is like a seed, needing the right conditions to sprout and reach out into the light. It is always small and fragile, but also strong and hardy. Jesus knows better than the head-counters that faith comes from some small mysterious place deep inside and doesn't simply sprout out the top of our heads. This is something we can all count on.
