# Dear friends,

This weekend we conduct our annual Catholic Mission Appeal. One example of the missionary Church supported by Catholic Mission is the Church in Ethiopia: Subsistence farming is the way of life for millions of people in Ethiopia. Yet, persistent drought and increasing food prices result in many experiencing health problems due to a lack of nutritious food. Distressingly, 70% of families in the town of Emdibir are unable to put enough food on the table. Helping with the practicalities that make life possible is at the core of missionary outreach. Giving to those most in need is a sign of compassion and witnesses to the commandment in love. Catholic Mission is partnering with the local Church in Emdibir to finance a goat farm to help reduce the risk of child mortality in the community due to malnutrition. 2022 is the 200th anniversary of Pauline Jaricot starting the Society for the Propagation of the Faith in Lyon, France. Pauline Jaricot's was beatified on the 22<sup>nd</sup> May 2022 in Lyon. Pauline is a wonderful example and witness of God's love.

Pauline Marie Jaricot was born on 22 July 1799 into a family of rich Lyon silk merchants. After hearing a Lenten homily against worldly vanities, the then 17-year-old experienced a radical conversion, abandoning the worldliness of her previous life, and began to visit and take care of the poor. In 1820, Pauline received a letter from her brother Phileas, a student at the Seminary of St. Sulpice, in which he explained the needs of the members of the Paris Foreign Missions Society. Pauline gathered the workers in her father's factory into groups of ten to donate a sou (a penny/cent) to support foreign missions. Each participant would then recruit another 'ten'. The 'tens' become 'hundreds' and eventually gathered momentum beyond Lyon. The Society was formally approved in 1822. Your support from this appeal will make a difference to those in less fortunate circumstances than our own. We welcome our guest speakers for the 2022 Mission Appeal, Martin Lewis (Cathedral), and Paul Mulligan (St Patrick's).

Saturday 19th November from 10 am to 2pm at The Hanly Room, Francis Rush Centre. Refreshments provided.


