
31ST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR C – 30TH OCTOBER 2022

Dear friends,

There's an old saying about standing on the shoulders of giants. It is most popularly attributed to Sir Isaac Newton but it goes back further than that, to 12th century figure of Bernard of Chartres (some say it goes back to the 6th century). The dating is unimportant. Rather it is the sentiment that counts. Bernard compared the thinkers of his contemporary moment to "dwarfs perched on the shoulders of giants". He pointed out that we see more and farther than our predecessors, not because we have keener vision or greater height, but because we are lifted up and borne aloft on their considerable intellect.

Bernard of Chartres wasn't belittling his contemporaries. He was acknowledging that human advancement and progress isn't the result of our own superachievements but is built upon generations of common endeavour. If we didn't have foundations to draw upon, and thereby lifted up, we wouldn't see a thing.

Zacchaeus is struggling to see because the crowd are a hindrance and not a help. He is small in stature which prevents him from seeing Jesus, whom, we are told, he is anxious to see. As a tax collector, he is seen as traitor and therefore no one was willing to lift him up; he had to climb up by himself. The crowd actually obstruct his view rather than bear him on their shoulders. His anxiety drives him higher but it also leads him straight into the eye-line of Jesus.

Too often we are the crowd who block the eye line of others and prevent them from seeing Jesus. We obstruct the view of others through our selfishness, our nastiness, our pettiness or our judgements. By lifting one another high through simple words and gestures of encouragement and acceptance, people don't need to climb a tree to see Jesus. We all see further when one of us grows taller and we all grow taller in the sight of Jesus.


Cathedral Concert Series 2022






