### Dear friends,

You will notice that the Cathedral is lit in red during the month of November. It is one way in which we draw attention to the persecution of Christians throughout the world. On Wednesday, 23rd November (5:10pm), the Archbishop will celebrate Mass for persecuted Christians. Persecution is any form of hostility experienced as a result of practicing Christian faith. This can look different for the hundreds of millions of believers who face persecution every day. For some, it is a denial of basic needs like clean water, food and healthcare, because of their faith in Jesus. Or rejection from their non-Christian family and community. For others, Christian persecution is acts of physical violence, imprisonment, or even death. One in seven Christians worldwide are persecuted for their faith. More than 360 million Christians worldwide suffer very high or extreme levels of persecution and discrimination for their faith.

There are two main ways Christians experience persecution: violence and pressure. The top ten countries which were identified as the places of greatest violence and pressure are: Afghanistan; North Korea; Somalia; Libya; Yemen; Eritrea; Nigeria; Pakistan; Iran; and India. During this month of November, let us offer our prayer support and also raise awareness of

the plight of Christians as the struggle to live and practice their faith on a daily basis:

Lord Jesus Christ, as the Good Shepherd, You call all people to yourself.

You also foresaw that following the path of the gospel would be met with opposition.

Be near those who suffer daily because of their commitment to you.

Through them, you continue your passion for the redemption of the world.

*Give them the grace to carry the cross with* уои.

Grant us all strength and courage to willingly follow you, regardless of the cost of discipleship.

Help us support our sisters and brothers in their need, so that they may know that all who call themselves Christian journey with them and that they are not abandoned and alone.

Fill us with your merciful love, that we may also bless our enemies and forgive them.

May our witness show forth your presence in the world and may you lead us through faith to fullness of life in You. Amen.
