Dear friends,

25 years has passed since my ordination to priestly ministry. In may ways, "25" is only a number, insignificant in itself. In other ways, it is a moment in my personal story that provides an opportunity to pause and recall the various threads that have been woven into my memory and experience. Anniversaries of any kind are only as meaningful as we want to make them, and what has become meaningful to me this year is my sense of profound gratitude. If the truth be known, and if I had been left to my own devices, I would have stumbled from one bumbling episode to another – and yes, that certainly would be one accurate way of describing the last 25 years. However, my sense of profound gratitude is grounded in the realisation that I haven't be left to my own devices. Against the usual patterns of own personal preferences, I have said "yes" to every opportunity that has been given to me. Not all of those "yeses" have been easy, but they have all been graced. Gratitude is always the fruit of grace received, unmerited and unasked.

25 years ago, on a hot, humid night in November, standing in the Cathedral of St. Stephen before Archbishop Bathersby and surrounded by the presbyterate of Brisbane and the people of God, I never dreamed of the course that my life as a priest has taken me or the adventures that

have been part of that course. Despite various emotional and spiritual valleys at times, these years have been a grace and a gift.

The greatest gift to me has been relationships. I have become a profound believer in this simple pilgrim's truth: God always provides you with the companions that you need. When I think of places, I think of people: family, friends, colleagues, parishioners, strangers. Any road in life, any vocation, is impossible and unbearable without the well-springs of friendship and, in particular on this day, I give thanks for all those who have helped me continue the journey. Whatever might be "best" in me is only due to the goodness, kindness, generosity, honesty and commitment of others. All of these qualities, and all of these relationships, come from God. Ordained ministry is indeed a wonderful privilege but it also a vocation that takes a whole lifetime to grow into, so I remain a "work under construction", but aren't we all.

Thank you to the Cathedral staff and this community for being part of my story and allowing me to be part of yours. Thank you also for your generosity to me during this time. I only pray that, through God's grace, I am able to offer something in return, however humble, for the sake of the gospel.

Thursday 17th at 11:00am Ambrose Treacy College will celebrate and at 4:30pm St Joseph's Gregory Terrace.






