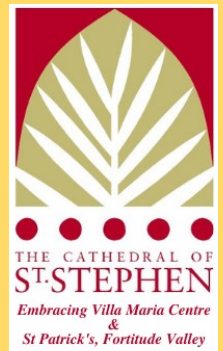


OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE YEAR C – 20TH NOVEMBER 2022

Dear Friends

This Sunday the Church celebrates the Solemnity of 'Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe', more popularly known under its simple title of 'Christ the King.' In 1925, Pope Pius XI established the solemnity with his encyclical *Quas primas* as a response to the aggressive secularism which was fast spreading in the wake of the First World War. It was Pope Pius's hope that the establishment of this solemnity would serve as a reminder not only to Christians but to all leaders and nations of the Kingship of Christ and the Church's right to proclaim the gospel, free from interference by the state. It was also to be an exhortation for Catholics to profess and live their faith not only as private individuals but also in the public square, where Christianity was becoming increasingly sidelined.

"Viva Cristo Rey!" ('Long live Christ the King!') were the last words of 36 year-old Jesuit Father Miguel Pro as he faced his executioners in Mexico in 1927. His courageous words were a

bold proclamation of the kingship of Christ in the face of a regime committed to the ruthless persecution of the Church in that country. Fr Miguel tirelessly assisted the poor in Mexico City in their spiritual and material needs, adopting many creative disguises in carrying out his secret ministry. He would wander at night dressed as a beggar so as not to attract attention as he went to homes to perform baptisms, bless marriages, hear confessions and celebrate Mass. He was known to appear in jail dressed as a police officer to administer the Last Rites to condemned Catholics. When going to fashionable neighbourhoods to minister he would dress as a stylish businessman. His many exploits could rival those of the most daring spies. Fr Miguel was beatified in 1988.

History tells us that kingdoms and regimes come and go, and with them their respective kings and rulers - some of whom wished to dominate exclusively. Today's solemnity is a reminder that only in Jesus Christ do we have a Servant King whose reign of love embraces each one of us and indeed 'all that is seen and unseen'.

Bicycle for Sale

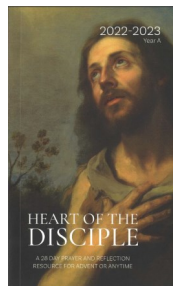

Book of Remembrance

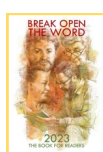
You are invited to inscribe the names of those whom you want to remember in the **Book of Remembrance**, located near the sanctuary. May they all *rest in peace*.

The 10:00am Solemn Mass is led by the Cathedral Choir, the music for this Mass is inside this bulletin.




