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Advent Candle Ritual for the First Sunday of Advent – Year A

Priest: As we celebrate the season of Advent we think again of the love of God for us, endless and ever new, symbolised in this circle of greenery. The candles of the wreath signify how this

eternal and all-embracing love has been manifested in time, and will be manifest forever when the Lord appears in glory. On this First Sunday of Advent, we bless our Advent

wreath and light the first of the candles, looking forward to the Day of the Lord.

Blessing of Advent Wreath

Priest: Lord our God, we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ: He is Emmanuel, the hope of the

peoples, he is the wisdom that teaches and guides us, he is the Saviour of every nation. Lord God, let your blessing come upon us as we light the candles of this wreath. May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation.

May he come quickly and not delay.

Through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

The wreath is sprinkled with holy water.

Then one candle is lit as the cantor sings "Christ Be Our Light"

All: We watch for new light to shine as the season of joy approaches.

Priest: Christ is our rock and our refuge, an ever present help in trouble.

All: We wait in hope, attentive to all the signs of Christ's coming.

Priest: May Almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins and bring us to everlasting life.

All: Amen.






