

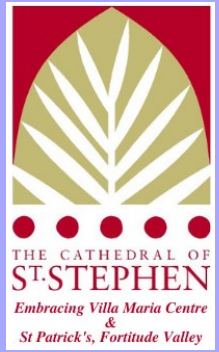
# THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

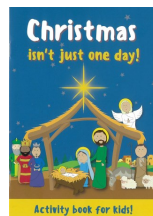

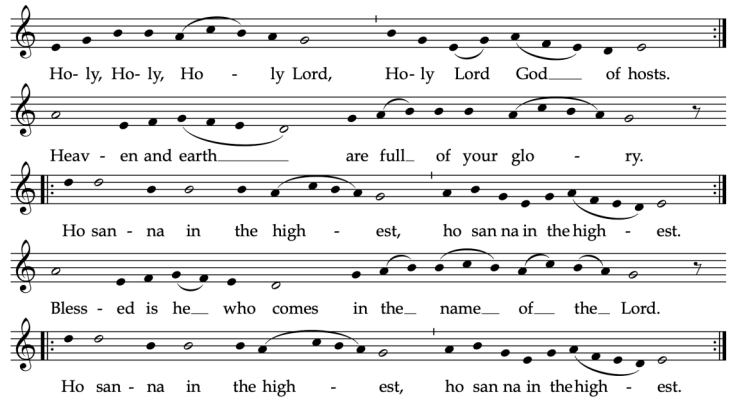

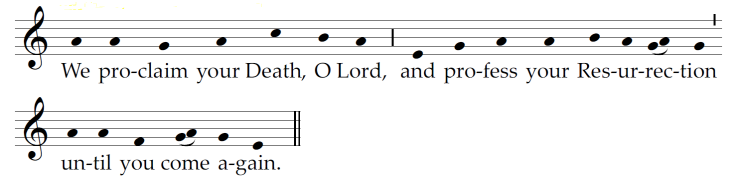
