

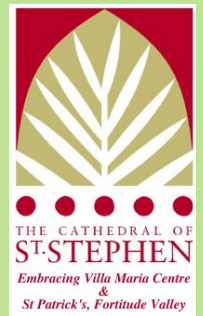

Dear friends,

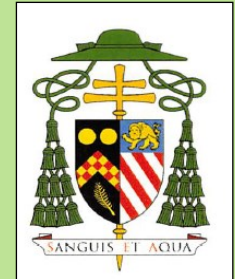
We only just seem to have emerged from our Christmas-New Year slumber and we are back into Ordinary Time again. In about six weeks time we will be pondering Ash Wednesday and the approach of Lent. Nevertheless, it would be a mistake to interpret Ordinary Time as the time in-between the big events when nothing much important happens. The truth of the matter is that Ordinary Time is when most of life happens. It's colour of green is intended to remind us of the possibility of life and growth and, therefore, it is far from a time of stagnation and inertia.

Most of the important things—the things that will truly shape us this year—will happen during the period of “Ordinary Time”. There will be the usual routine of things, which can seem on the surface to be mundane and boring, but in reality hold the key to our patterns of human growth and maturing, and establish the rhythm of how we live. Amid the ordinary, there are always the simple and ordinary daily joys to look forward to which sustain our peace and life.

There will also be the challenges and the difficulties that are part and parcel of every life. How we face the unexpected will demonstrate how we have grown and matured as human beings during the ordinary times. Every now and then, some things will come along that will seem insurmountable, and will test the limits of our emotional and physical resources. This is when we become thankful for the gifts of faith, hope and love and the strength drawn from our connection to community. Nothing is ever insurmountable when faced with God and others.

Ordinary Time is the longest feast of the year because every Sunday, and indeed every day, we celebrate that Jesus is Risen and lives among us. His life makes all things green with the promise of life that never fades. Jesus makes the ordinary extraordinary by virtue of the gift of his Spirit which breathes fresh possibilities into each and every moment. Don't be deceived by the title “ordinary” because these days are the play-ground of God.





Support for the Cathedral Parish




