

Everyone is invited to gather to pray for our Country and all our peoples.


#### Advent Appeal for Ukrainian People

The Cathedral livestreaming service commenced in 2013. Currently an aggregate of 2500 people access the weekday Mass, either live or on-demand, and over 1,000 views for the Sunday Mass. This is a very valuable outreach to those who are unable to physically attend Mass but want to spiritually remain connected to the Cathedral.


