

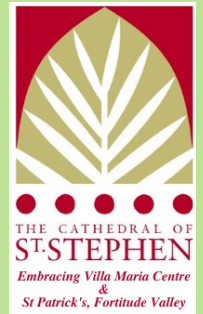

Dear friends,

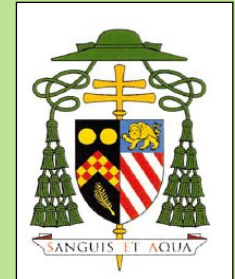
The first part of today's gospel is a series of examples – commands in reality – about how to be disarmingly imaginative when we are attacked, insulted, or put upon. Being hit on the right cheek would be a form of insult – a slap, something for example that a master might do to a slave. To offer the other cheek could be one of two things. Jesus is saying, stand firm and don't accept insults and preferably don't insult others in the first place. The word "other" can also mean your "back" – so in other words, Jesus is saying, "Turn around and walk away. Jesus isn't offering a crash course in self-defence, this wouldn't work in cases of domestic violence for example, but Jesus is teaching us to look at the ways in which we participate in or permit a culture of violence – physical or verbal, whether that is in our families, friends or our society. Jesus is asking something more of us than non-violence – he is commanding us to actively oppose violence in its many forms.

Probably the most creative thing that we can do as human beings is to turn our anger and hate into compassion and love. 'You have learnt how it was said: You must love your neighbour and hate your enemy. But I say this to you: love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you.'

Jesus asks us instead to become a glimmer of light amid the darkness of hate and violence. He challenges us to resist the instincts that anger provokes. We seek this not just for ourselves, but also for those who have harmed us. For example, how often do we say a prayer for those who have hurt us? This little gesture, however difficult, might open a doorway that we can eventually walk through to discover the home of forgiveness.

Our world needs people who do not give in to the provocations of the angry, the frustrated, the violent and the resentful. This is why we need to hear the words of Jesus, act on them and work towards breaking the cycles of hate.

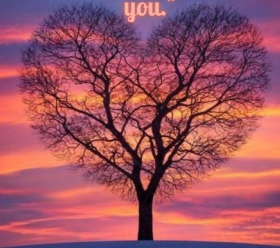

Lenten Concert Series

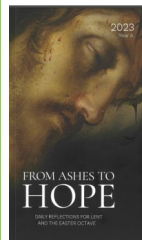
Each Thursday in March at 12 noon

Eternal Three-in-One.

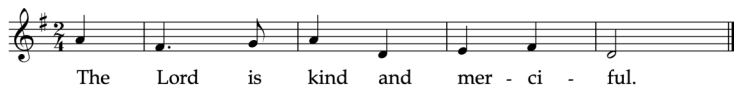

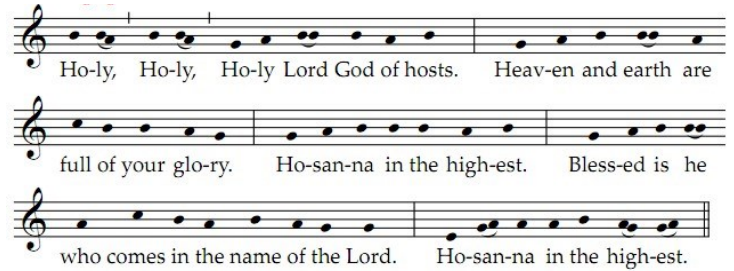

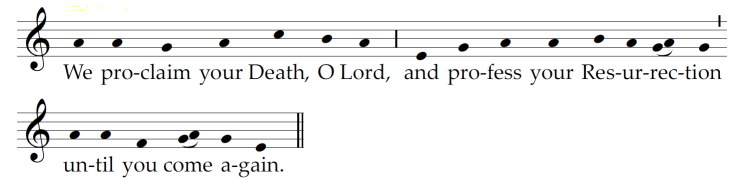
