

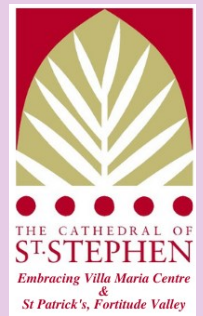
# SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

Dear friends,

The Cathedral of St. Stephen is one of the grand buildings of the city of Brisbane. It serves a number of purposes: a sacred place of worship and praise; the seat (cathedra) of the Archbishop of Brisbane; the mother church of local church of Brisbane; an inner city church which serves the CBD; and an important green intersection between religious space and civic space right in the heart of the capital. It is a building and precinct worth celebrating and acknowledging.

May 17, 2024 will mark the 150th anniversary of the opening and blessing of the original nave of the Cathedral by Bishop Quinn. On May 28 (Pentecost Sunday) this year, we will launch our year-long festival of activities and celebrations to mark this important occasions. There has been much preparatory work begun already to have worthy and enthusiastic celebrations of the building and its sacramental, ecclesial and civic life. After Easter, we will be able to share with you what is planned.

The four major foci of this year of celebration are:

- **Honour** the contribution of the Cathedral to both the local church and the city of Brisbane.
- **Acknowledge** the Cathedral as the centre of the sacramental and liturgical life of the Archdiocese
- **Promote** the Cathedral as a religious, cultural and civic icon within the broader community
- **Develop** a renewed mission of the Cathedral precinct.

The four themes of the year are:

- **Commemorate**
- **Celebrate**
- **Connect**
- **Commission**

We have employed David Todd as our 150th Anniversary Event Co-Ordinator who will commence this week. David will bring great skill and experience to this role. We look forward with excitement to celebrating the year ahead.

 And will be for eternity.

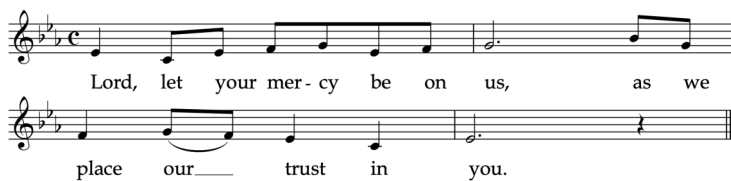
