Dear Friends

As we make our way through the season of Lent we recognise in the Mass readings themes such as sin and repentance, darkness and light, and this Sunday's gospel focusses on death and new life.

Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead after four days. Jesus had previously raised the daughter of Jairus, and also the son of the widow of Nain. In the Old Testament Elijah and Elisha raised people from the dead. But nowhere is there an instance of someone being raised from the dead after *four* days.

The raising of Lazarus is the crowning miracle of Jesus' ministry, and likely the main reason that led to his condemnation and death - the authorities could not afford to let the story get out.

The raising of Lazarus was a foreshadowing of Christ's own Resurrection after sacrificing himself for us. During Lent we strive in our own ways to conform ourselves more to this sacrificial love of Christ, that we too may share in his Resurrection.

May our hearts be purified and our gaze directed more purposefully and lovingly towards our ultimate goal - Christ, who alone is the Light of the World, and the fullness of Resurrection and New Life.
