
SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER YEAR A - 16TH APRIL 2023

Dear friends,

In recent weeks, Archbishop Mark has published a document entitled "Lamps Ablaze: **Apostolic** Priorities for the Archdiocese of Brisbane from 2023" which outlines seven priorities for us all to consider. Over the next seven weeks concluding with Pentecost, we will explore these apostolic priorities with reference to the readings for each Sunday. The first of these priorities is teaching prayer.

Archbishop Mark writes,

"We must first find our way into a new and deeper experience of prayer not just as one of many elements in a busy life but as a way of life for all the baptised. Often we urge people to pray but don't really teach them how to pray in a way that moves beyond the prayers of childhood and youth. Now is the time to teach ways of prayer which are mature and all-embracing."

Our guide to entering into a new and deeper experience of prayer is an unlikely suspect: 'doubting' Thomas. At the heart of prayer is honest and authentic It is in this honest and authentic engagement that Thomas has much to teach us. Thomas provides us with three insights into authentic engagement with God and the faithful.

Thomas teaches us about prayer and about doubt. Firstly, we can be honest with God and with others about how we're going with our faith! Real relationship, real trust, begins with truth telling. We can be honest with God. Secondly, when we're struggling with our faith and struggling with our prayer, we, like Thomas, should stay connected to the community of faith, and we should always welcome those who are struggling with their faith. Finally, God meets us where we're at. Just as Jesus responded to Thomas' doubts, so Jesus can respond to ours if we can look to Jesus. In these Easter weeks, let us ask our Lord to help us find our way into a new and deeper experience of prayer, which is a new and deeper experience of the risen Christ: "Lord I believe, help my unbelief" (Mark 9:24). Amen




Run Army – Sunday 23 April 2023

First Communion

Young people who have received the Sacrament of Confirmation last year when they were in Year 3 are now eligible to make their First Communion (Eucharist) this year. Eucharist is the third of the three Sacraments of Initiation, which commenced at Baptism. The process involves participation in two preparation sessions (for parent and child) and the completion of a student workbook.

The first Preparation Session will be on Sunday, 7th May, at 2pm in the Hanly Room at the Cathedral. The second Preparation Session will be held four weeks later on Sunday, 4th June at St Joseph's Church, Kangaroo Point. Both sessions will last for approximately one hour only. <u>Attendance at both sessions is essential</u>.

Eucharist (First Communion) will then take place during Mass on the weekend of 10th – 11th June.


