Dear friends,

In recent week's we have been exploring Archbishop Mark's Apostolic Priorities. The third of these priorities is *Bringing the Cultural Communities to the Centre*.

Archbishop Mark writes:

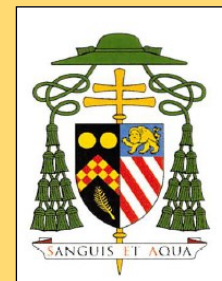
"The face of the Church around the world is changing as the centre of gravity shifts from places like Europe and North America (and Australia) to Africa, Asia and Latin America...

Certainly in the Archdiocese the presence of people who have come from overseas – from Vietnam, the Philippines, the Pacific islands, India, Sri Lanka, Latin America, Africa – is growing stronger...

These large and growing communities have gifts for the whole Church, and increasingly the centre of gravity in the Church here is moving in their direction. Therefore, they have to be brought more to centre-stage in the life and mission of the Archdiocese, since much of

the real spiritual energy in the Church here is found among them. This again will involve significant cultural change for the whole Church in this part of the world."

In today's Gospel, Jesus refers to the shepherd and the sheep, but identifies himself as the gate. "I am the gate. Anyone who enters through me will be safe: he will go freely in and out and be sure of finding pasture." It is in passing through the gate, Jesus, that we are united in Christ and with each other." Jesus draws all of humanity to himself. It is from the cultural and racial inclusivity of Jesus that we learn to engage with every tribe and nation, following the example of the good shepherd in welcoming all people and doing what we can to ensure that the Gospel is accessible to all. Cultural diversity is not accidental to the Christian community, but essential! Through the Good Shepherd, we are drawn into relationship with God in order that we might "have life and have it abundantly."

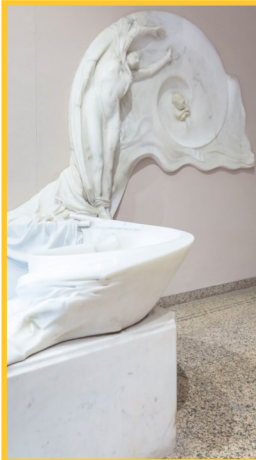

Communion from the Cup

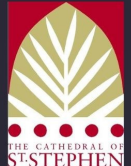
Now that the Cup has been reintroduced for Communion at all Sunday masses, it is timely to remind everyone of the standard Communion protocols. In the first instance, the Host is taken on the hand or in the mouth from the priest or minister and consumed immediately. If a person then wishes to partake of the Cup, they move across to the Communion Minister holding the Cup at the side aisle. The person takes the Cup as it is offered, then returns the Cup to the minister, who will then wipe the rim thoroughly turning the Cup a quarter, before handing the Cup to the next communicant.

PLEASE NOTE: Intinction is *not* permitted – that is, it is not appropriate to hold on to the Host that you have received and intinct (dip) it into the Cup.

First Communion

The first Preparation Session will be on **Sunday, 7th May, at 2pm** in the Hanly Room at the Cathedral. The second Preparation Session will be held four weeks later on **Sunday, 4th June** at St Joseph's Church, Kangaroo Point. Both sessions will last for approximately one hour only. Attendance at both sessions is essential. Eucharist (First Communion) will then take place during Mass on the weekend of 10th – 11th June. 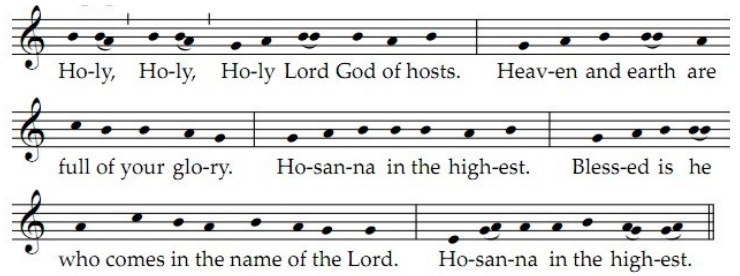

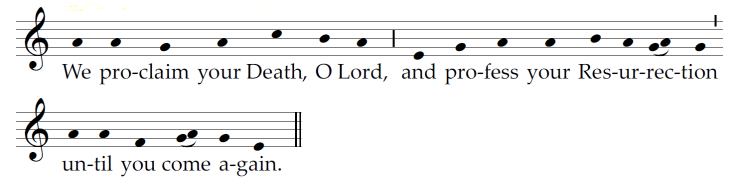

The 10:00am Solemn Mass is led by the Cathedral Choir, the music for this mass is inside this bulletin.

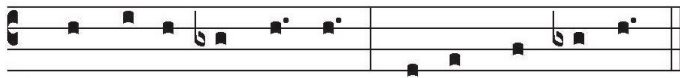
