

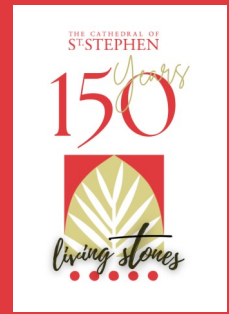
PENTECOST SUNDAY

Dear friends,

On this feast of Pentecost, we come to the last of Archbishop Mark's Apostolic Priorities: *Embedding Synodal Governance*.

Have you ever been in a situation where you're the only person who doesn't speak the language that everyone is talking? It's a strange feeling. You're in the same place, you're with other people, but you have no idea what is being said.

You can't understand what is going on, and you can't contribute.

Whether it was intentional or not, you are inevitably excluded. On this great celebration of Pentecost, we turn our attention to the birth of a truly inclusive Church and what this kind of inclusion means for the seventh and final apostolic priority: *Embedding Synodal Governance*.

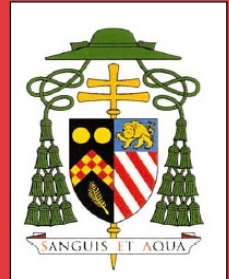
Archbishop Mark writes:

We have begun the long and complex process of moving towards a synodal mode of governance in the Church, but the process is far from complete; and there is much to be done to embed synodal governance more securely at every level in

the Archdiocese... Synodality implies inclusion, and therefore we will have to keep asking how we might at every level include women in the decision-making processes of the Archdiocese. So too synodality requires transparency and accountability, and we will have to keep asking what we need to do to make the Archdiocese more transparent and accountable.

On this birthday of the Church, we are reminded that the Church is inspired and empowered by the Holy Spirit to be inclusive and to preach the Gospel in language that everyone can understand. We are challenged to ask ourselves, are we a parish/community that is inspired and empowered by the Holy Spirit?

We recognise that a truly inclusive Church must have truly inclusive leadership. May the Holy Spirit guide us and lead us as we journey toward becoming a more inclusive, synodal and Spirit-empowered Church.
