Dear friends,

The year of celebration for the 150th anniversary of the Cathedral continues to unfold. One the eve of the Feast of Sts. Peter and Paul, we will acknowledge the Sacrament of Holy Orders which has been celebrated in the Cathedral since its opening in 1874. Archbishop Mark Coleridge will preside at the 10am Mass on Wednesday, 28th June, and you are invited to be part of this celebration and gather in thanksgiving for the service and ministry of the many ordained ministers who have served the local church of Brisbane generously and faithfully across 150 years.

Fr Martin Mulhall was the first priest ordained in the new St Stephen's Cathedral in 1877. This was the fourth ordination in Brisbane, with the previous three all being ordained in, what is now, St. Stephen's Chapel.

Bishop Robert Dunne, the second bishop of Brisbane was the first episcopal consecration in St. Stephen's in 1882. Therefore, there is a long history of the Sacrament

of Holy Orders being a part of the history of this Cathedral. Over the course of the next 12 months, we will have celebrations for marriages, sacraments of Initiation, memorial for the faithful departed and other events to commemorate the liturgical life of the Cathedral.

Another opportunity to explore the Cathedral space, is the Fourteen Stations of the Cathedral Pilgrimage. This can be prayed individually, as a family, or in small groups. The fourteen stations are various points around the Cathedral where we can consider the architecture, iconography and the liturgical and devotional aspects of the Cathedral and pause for a brief moment of prayer in each place.

Booklets are available at the front doors of the Cathedral and you are welcome to pray a few stations at a time or walk the Cathedral Pilgrimage any number of times. I would like to acknowledge the work of Fr. Tom Elich for the development and production of the booklet.
