Dear friends,

St. Paul leads us through a reflection on baptism this Sunday. He provides us with a short summary of what the sacrament of baptism offers us: “When we were baptised in Christ Jesus we were baptised in his death; in other words, when we were baptised we went into the tomb with him and joined him in death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the Father's glory, we too might live a new life.” So our baptism is all about the death and resurrection of Jesus and therefore all about the death and resurrection of each of us.

Baptism isn't something that happened to us back there in the past. It is something that continues to help and guide us. So whenever we make choices for “life” rather than “death”, we are choosing to live the gift of our baptism. So what are these choices? What do they look like? From the days of our childhood, we are encouraged to live in the ways of kindness.

We seek to be children of generosity, empathy and understanding. So whether as children or as adults, we are encouraged, indeed summoned, to live the reality of the grace of baptism. Paul is simply naming that as mature adults, we need to take some responsibility for the people that we are becoming. And this requires choices.

Whenever we choose to be people of faith, hope and love rather than people of cynicism, despair and division we are living our baptism. And “choice” always requires some form of death. Participating in Christ's death is also to participate in his life, so that we do not find ourselves in a dead-end. For when Jesus died, “he died, once for all, to sin, so his life now is life with God; and in that way, you too must consider yourselves to be dead to sin but alive for God in Christ Jesus.” Being alive in Christ Jesus is to choose faith, hope and love, each and every day.

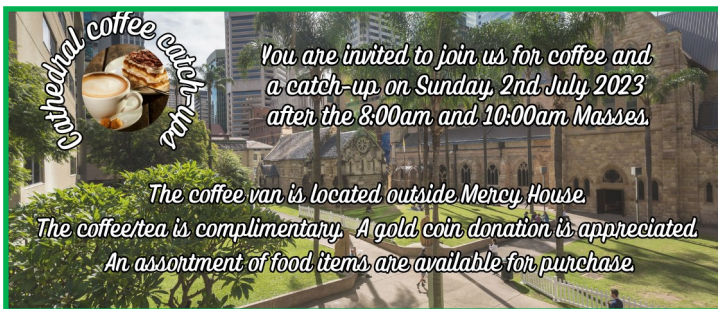
