Dear friends,

"The Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God."

These words of St. Paul give us great reassurance that our most desperate prayers do not require the correct formula or perfect repetition of the right words, nor even the purest of intentions or a concentration of the mind for God to be open to our pleas. Our prayers begin from weakness; we are mere creatures of our Creator, human beings who constantly stand in need of God's assistance and grace. If our prayers started from a position of strength or perfection, we would have no need of God and therefore no real need to pray. We pray because we need help, guidance and courage. Notice how St. Paul teaches us that it is God who does all the work when we pra

know how to pray as we ought," so the "Spirit intercedes (for us) with sighs too deep for words." In truth, our deepest prayers are God speaking to God. Sometimes, we can be so fearful that God is far away or ignoring us. In desperation, we turn our most anxious and earnest words into forms of "babbling like the pagans do". Paul's words are clear: we are never really able to find the right words, so let us simply present ourselves before God, allow the Spirit to do all the work and let "God speak to God". God "searches our heart" with a searing love and reaches deeper than our clumsy words, and our fretting spirit. This Spirit of Prayer intercedes according "to the will of God": our humbled and mumbled prayers are transformed into God speaking to God about God's will for us. Authentic prayer becomes not a bombardment of intent, but a deep and quiet listening—an "overhearing" — of God's loving conversation with God about us and for us. *Fr. Anthony*
