Receiving Holy Communion

As our worship at Mass returns to some semblance of pre-COVID normality, we provide a timely reminder of the correct and appropriate way of receiving the Body and Blood of Christ at Communion.

1. When receiving the Body of Christ:

- a. Make a small bow of reverence before moving up to the minister.
- b. If receiving the Host in the hand, place one hand under the other.
- c. When the minister says "The Body of Christ", reply clearly with "Amen".
- d. Step to one side and consume the Host *immediately*.
- e. If receiving on the tongue, open your mouth sufficiently and position your tongue to make the reception of the Host easy.

2. If receiving the Blood of Christ:

- a. When the minister offers you the Cup, they will say "The Blood of Christ" to which you reply "Amen".
- b. Take the Cup with both hands and drink a little from it.
- c. Hand the Cup back to the minister who will then purify the cup and ready it for the next person.

3. IMPORTANT:

In keeping with Christ's command to 'take and drink' and consistent with the Church's tradition that the sacraments be *ministered*, it is *not permitted* for communicants to dip the Host into the Cup (a process known as intinction).




