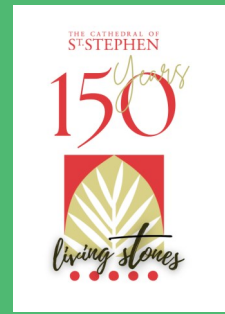


TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR A — 3RD SEPTEMBER 2023

Season of Creation Mass

LET JUSTICE & PEACE FLOW



On **Saturday, 9th September 2023 @ 6:00pm** Catholic Earthcare and the Catholic Justice and Peace Commission (CJPC), are hosting a Season of Creation with Mass at the Cathedral of St Stephen, presided over by Archbishop Mark Coleridge. Parishes and community groups are encouraged to bring a jar of water (river, sea or rainwater) from their area to add to an Archdiocesan urn that will be blessed and used to bless the congregation. Mass is followed by a free workshop in the Hanly Room (in the Francis Rush Centre) from 7pm to 8pm. Please consider who could represent your parish at the Mass.

Eagle Street Closure – 9:00pm Friday 8 September to 5:00am Monday 11 September

Next weekend, Eagle Street will be closed between Charlotte and Market Streets to all vehicle and pedestrian traffic while the pedestrian bridge over Eagle Street is removed.

Access to the Cathedral car park will still be available, however those coming via the riverside expressway should exit on Elizabeth Street, go down to the "big tree" and U-turn back to Eagle Street and into Charlotte St.

Depends on you indeed.

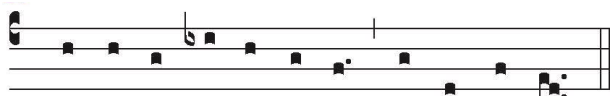
