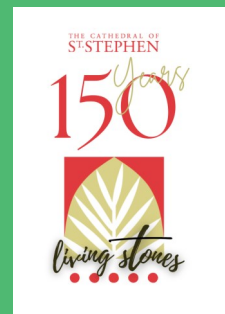


TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR A – 10TH SEPTEMBER 2023

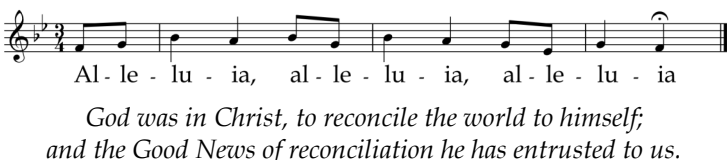

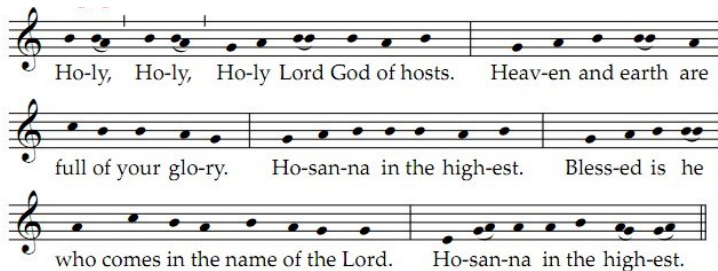

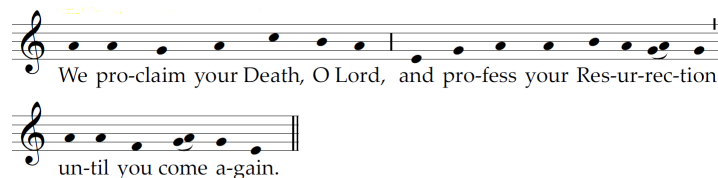
